It was a building like many in the West with living quarters in the rear. With no high school here, when the time came, Betty went away to boarding school, coming home only on weekends and summertime. After graduation she lived with an aunt in Beverly Hills, went to UCLA, worked and married, not to return to this Valley as a resident until 1957.

She lives an active life as attest the many organizations in which she has served: Pocohontas, state chairman of American Legion Auxiliary Girls, Native Daughters of the Golden West, Newhall Women's Club, Daughters of the American Revolution, president of Friends of Hart, board member for Committee on Aging, the planning committee for Senior Citizens Center, and once she was Newhall's Woman of the Year. For this Society she was on the first nominating committee, was a charter member, often a Board member and Landmarks chairman.
