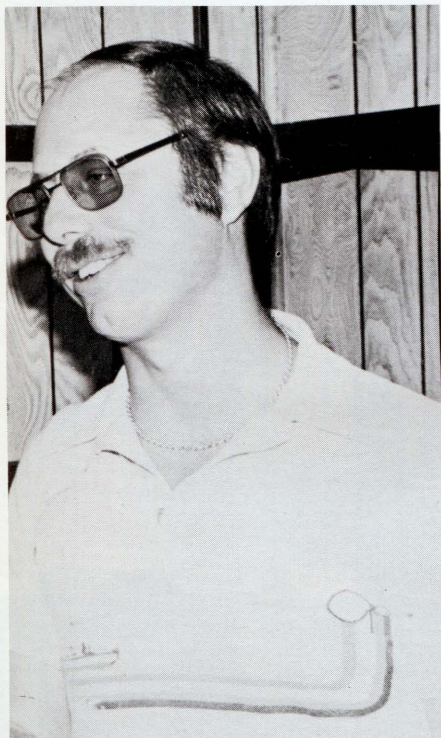
Imagination

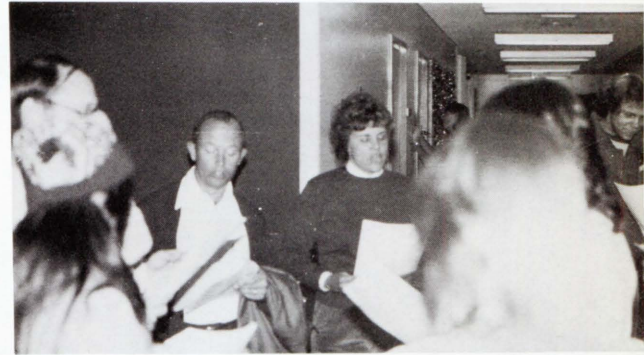
DECEMBER HOLIDAYS

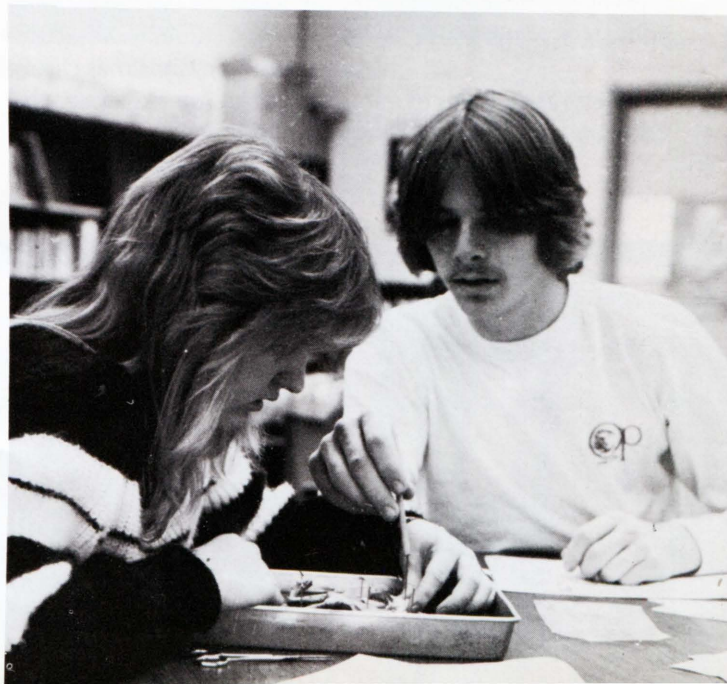
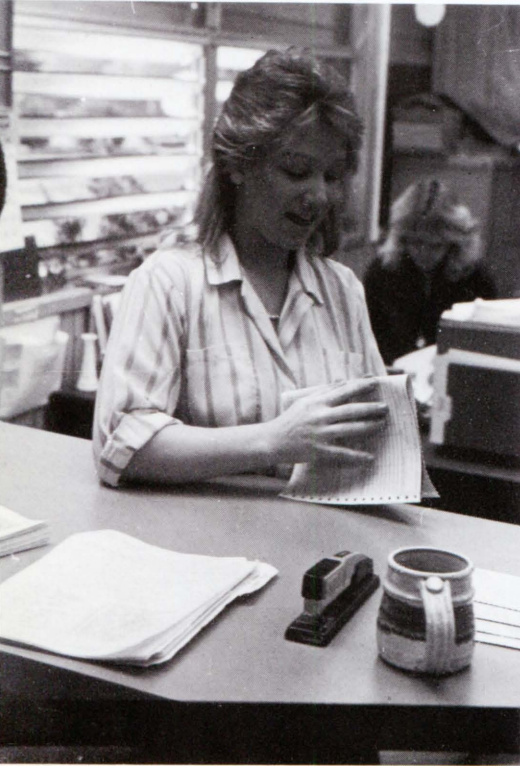
This year, Bowman students tried to repay some of the support which they have received from the community by taking part in some community service projects. In the process, they found much joy in helping others.

Each quarter a Counselor's list of the 20 students earning top credits is released. Thirteen of the top 20 students for the first quarter are shown in the picture to the left.

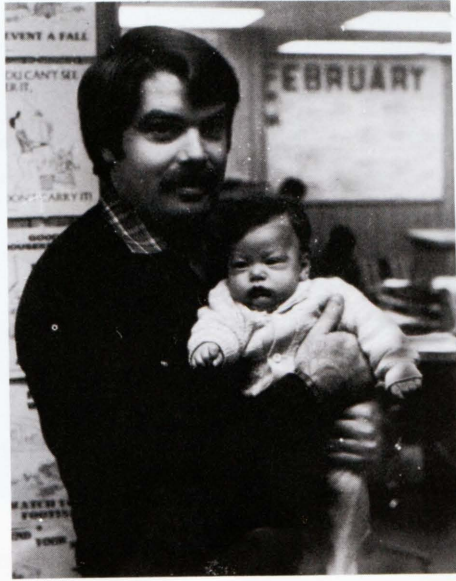

This has been a productive year for Bowman in more ways than one. We have seen a lot of babies on our campus. Both students and teachers have contributed to the big Baby Boom.

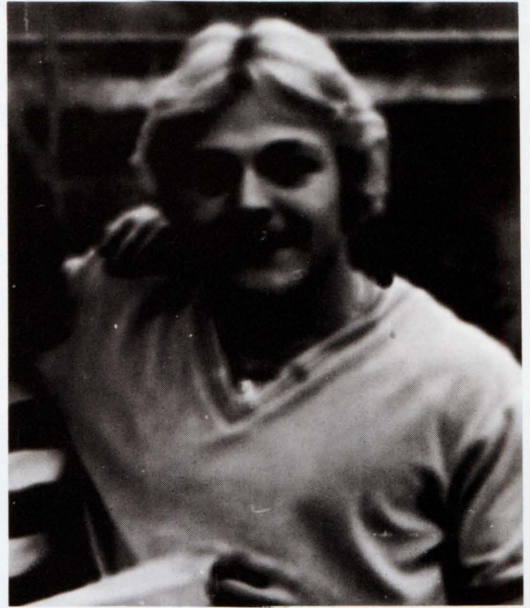

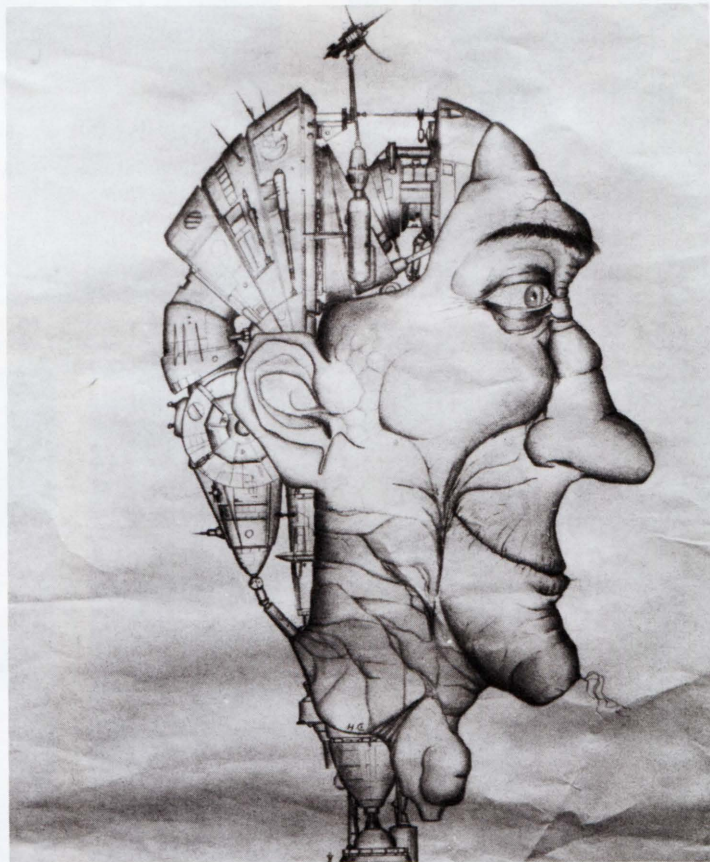
IMAGINATION CONTEST

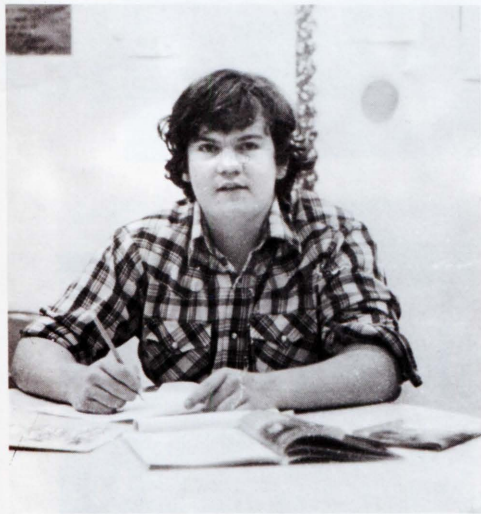

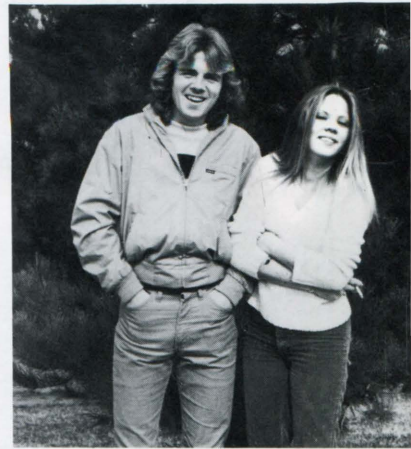

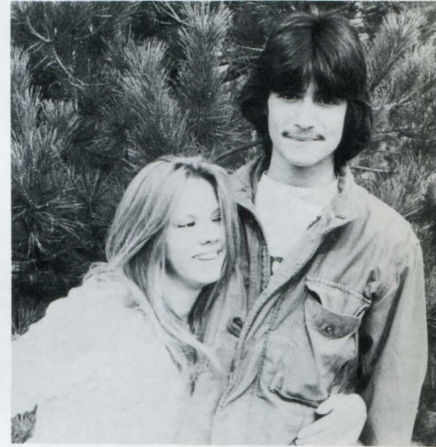

I Think That I Shall Never See . . .

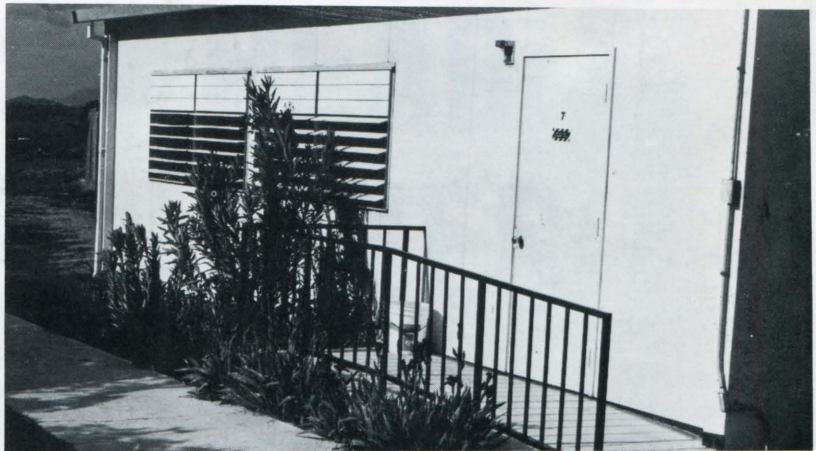
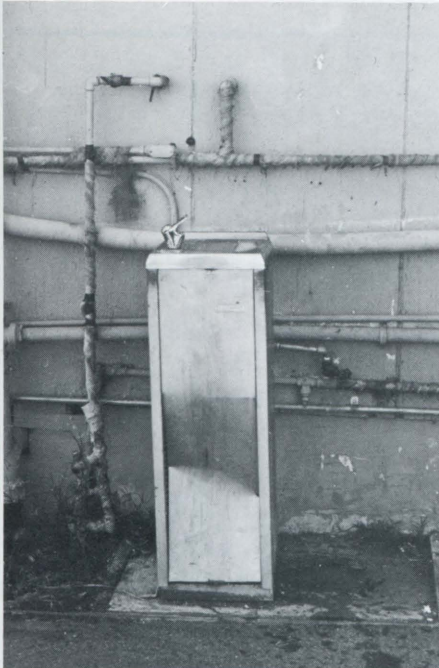
