



Jeremy Chinizi - 17

Learning how to play music was the best thing that ever happened to me because I can express myself without words.


Jason Seminario - 17



I'd like to go to a junior college when I graduate from Bowman. I am interested in Hypnotherapy.


Although I guess I'd describe myself as a laid back person, I think I can accomplish most all of my goals when I put my mind to it.


In my spare time I usually go to David's house or he comes to mine. I like riding horses and watching football games.

The best thing that ever happened to me is my move from Oxnard to Canyon Country.































Our Principal, Making A Difference

Students must attend one class meeting per week and furnish pay stub verification for credit.


