
Raul Traverso and Tarja Vahatiitto were both exchange students at Canyon this year Raul was from Chile and Tarja was from Finland.

Tarja said that in Finland, they had the same type of entertainment, such as movies and discos. She said that she enjoys soul music because it is good to dance with.







The Football Homecoming Queen of 1977 was Denise McCalla.













Girls Knock the Powder Off the Puff!

















Lillies of the Field

Parents, teachers, and administrators all had a positive reaction toward the evening as a whole.



The ceremonies took place in Canyon's gym, during the half time of the varsity game. Canyon defeated Burroughs by a score of 77-54.












Sadie Hawkins




Work Experience





Science Department Acquires Computer

Last year the Science Department acquired a Texas Instruments SR60A computer. This computer was used by Chemistry and Physics students. Data from experiments was entered into this computer and answers to mathematical problems were printed onto a computer readout. This computer proved to be a tremendous timesaver and great learning device for Chemistry and Physics students.

Highlights of the year included Mr. Dianz and Mr. Crissmans Biology field trips to Placerita Canyon in the fall. The purpose of this trip was to familiarize students with plants and animals of this area. Also, Mr. Hurd's Physics field trip to Big Bear. In Big Bear Physics students pointed out stars, planets, and constellations for bonus points.

Classes offered by the Science Department on the academic level were Introductory Physical Science, Biology/BSCS, Chemistry, Physics, and Advanced Biology, Non-academic classes were: Foundations of Science I and II, Life Science, and Earth Science.










Math Introduces New Program


Last year a new program was put into effect, the math lab. In the math lab students used an adding machine, computer, and cassette tapes to help them overcome these difficulties. As Ms. Johnson stated, "It's small, but it's a beginning."

The department offered a variety of classes last year. As usual, the Individualized Math Program (basic mathematics) was offered. In the college preparatory program, Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra 2, Trigonometry, Probability and Statistics, Math Analysis, and Calculus were offered.








The classes offered by the Fine Arts Department were Bànd, Art 2-D and 3-D, Chorus, Drama and Photo Journalism.




























Last year, the Industrial Arts Department acquired new photo processing equipment. This equipment enabled students of the photography classes to develop color negatives and print color pictures.




The Drivers' Education Department strives to teach students the rules of the road so they will become good drivers in our motorized society.


Banners






Amateur Radio






C.S.F.


Ski Club


Boys' swim team had a great season this year, finishing third in the league. The team also finished fourth overall in the 3-A finals as well as getting five golden league records.
















Sophomores Take Second in League














Frosh Baseball Shoots for the Top






Our Management Team






Counselors Work Under Heavy Load





What are Aids? What do they do? An Aid is someone who helps another person get the job done well. Without aids, teachers would have so much work to do that they would not have as much time to spend with the students.


