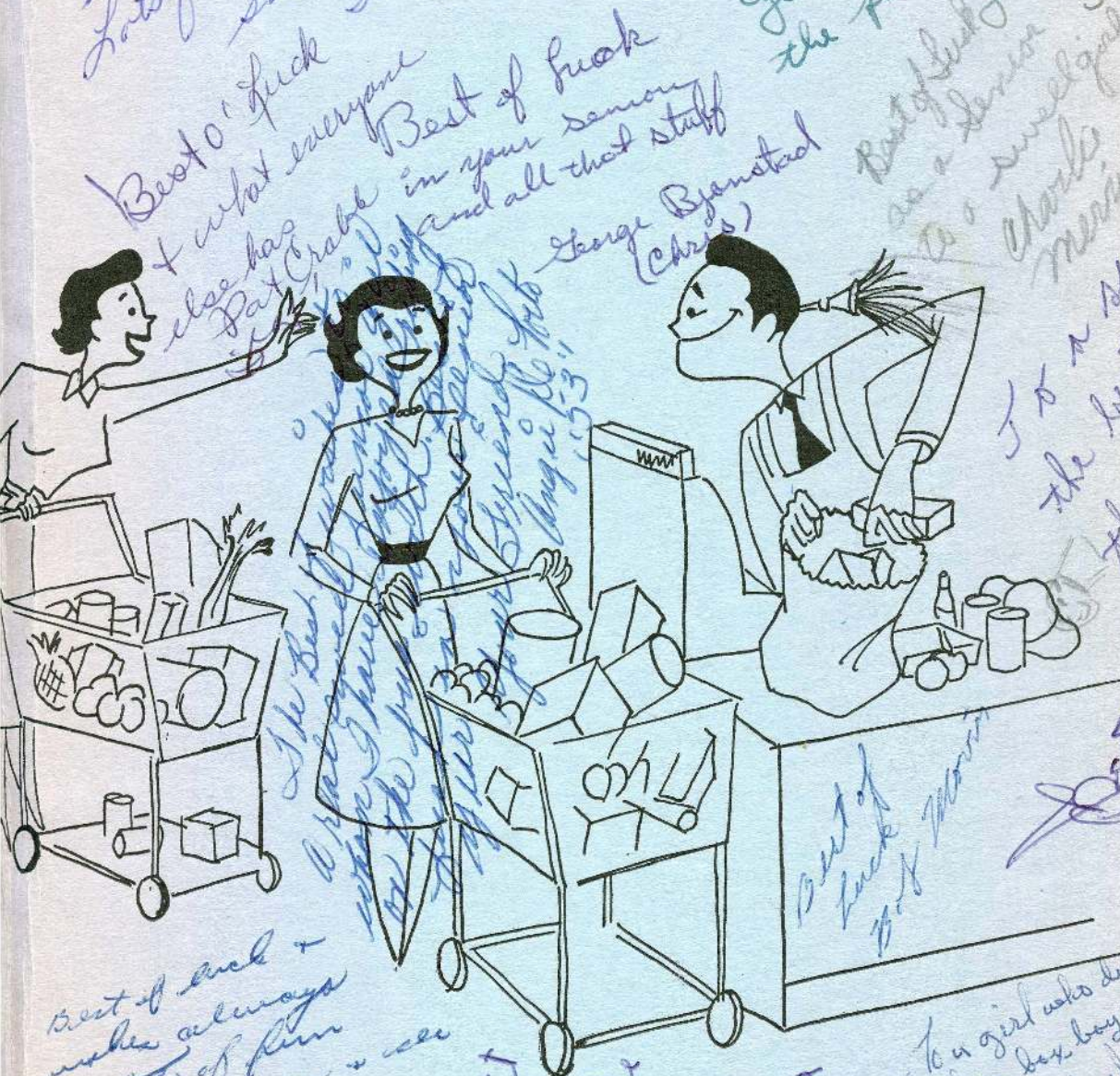

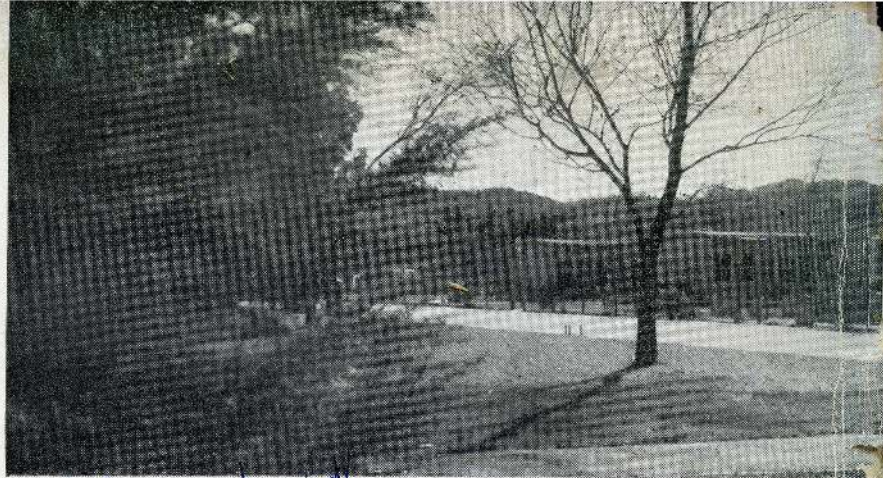

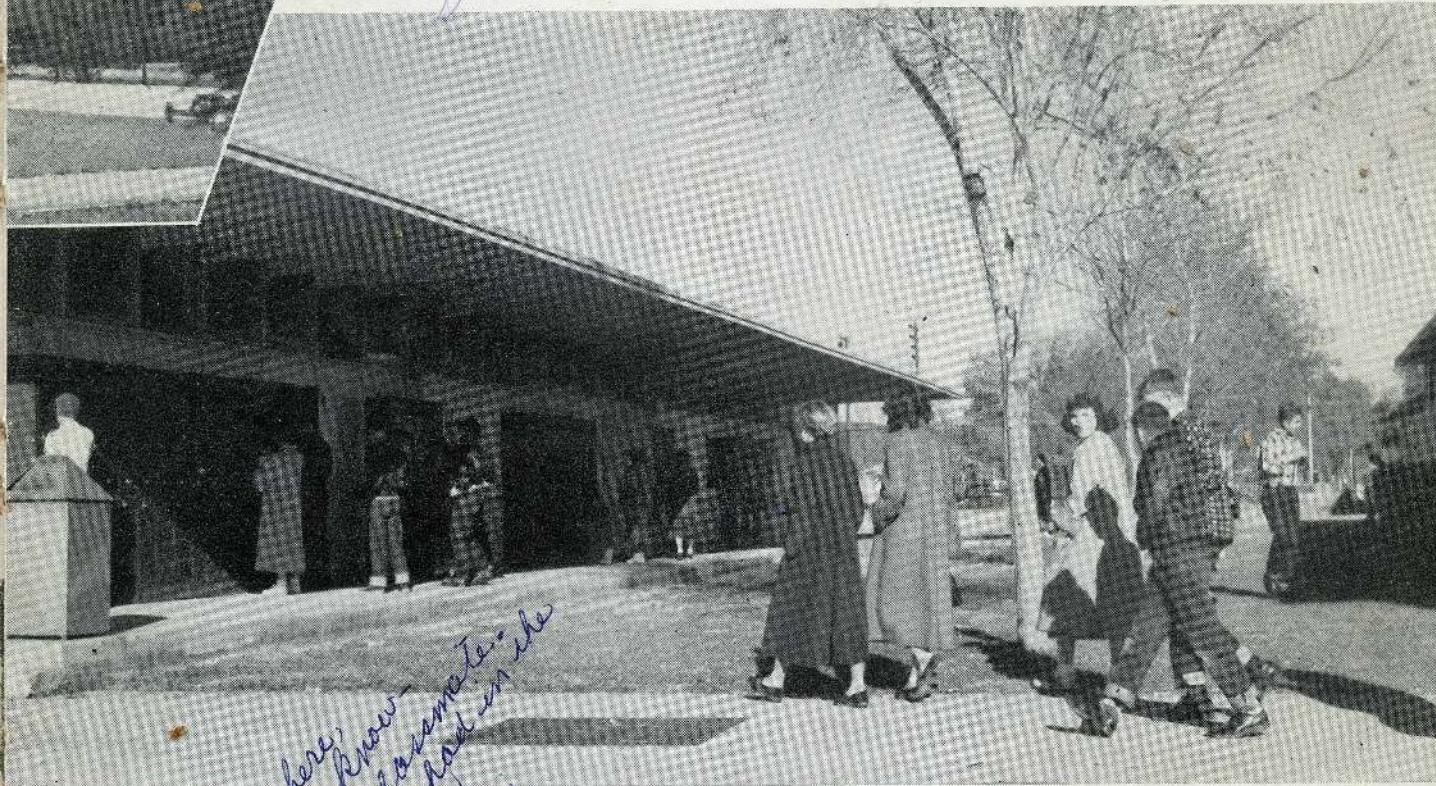

Our administration — the general managers—has many duties, among them the responsibility for the training and guiding of the produce. Another one of its duties is to keep the supermarket in smooth running order.

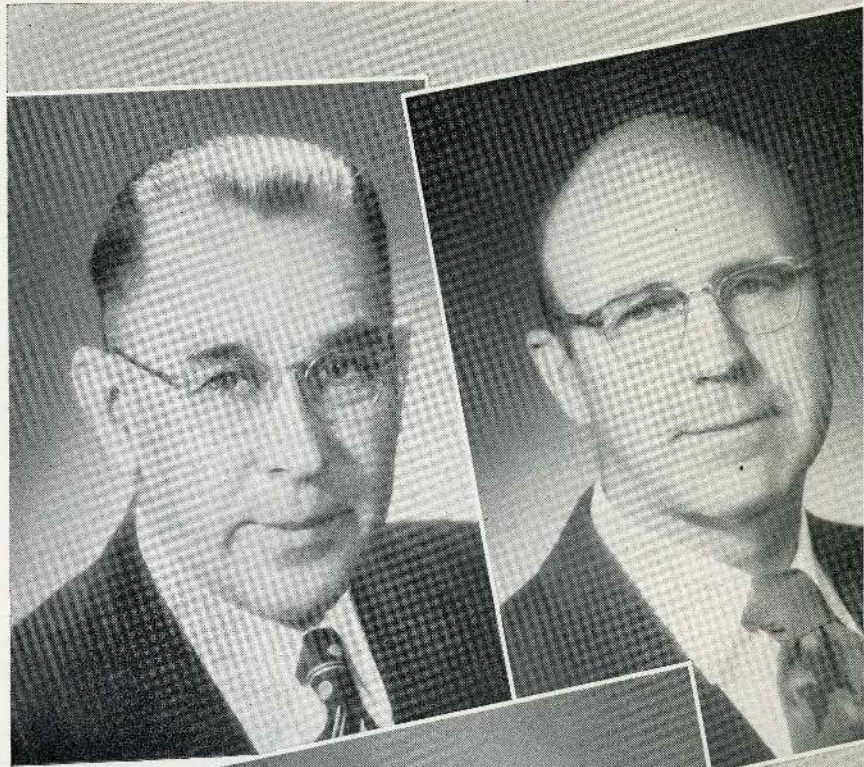

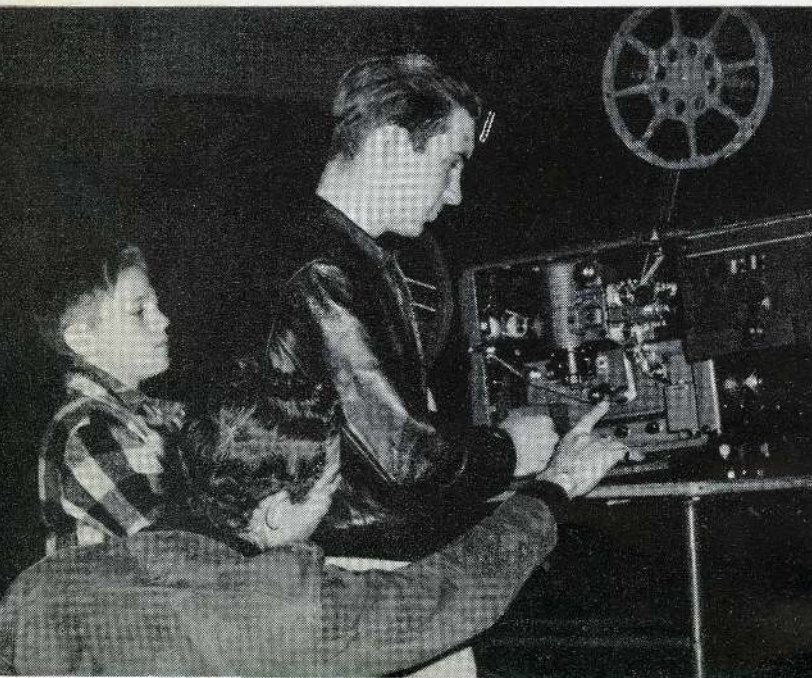
# Balanced Stock Found . . . On All Shelves

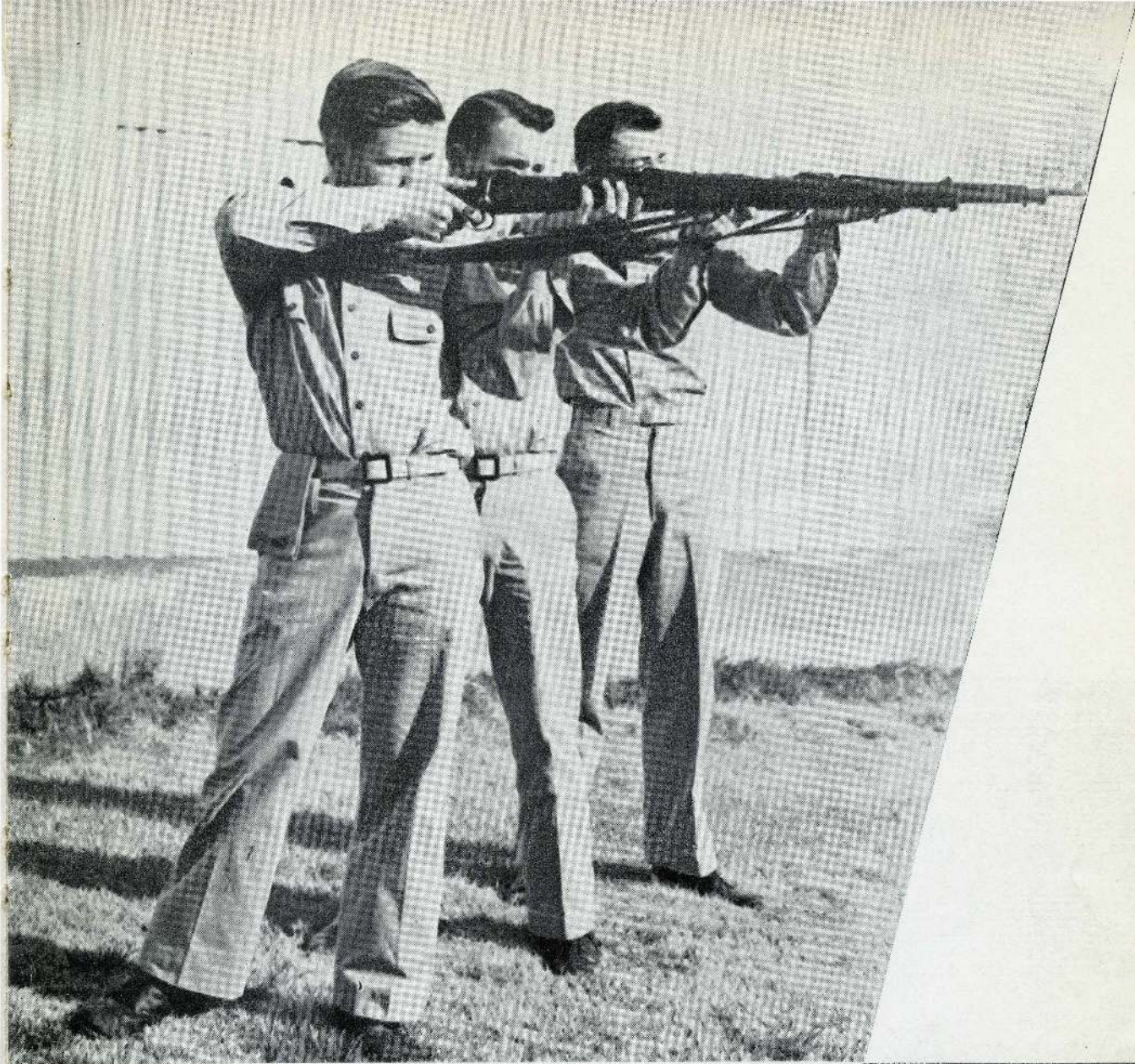

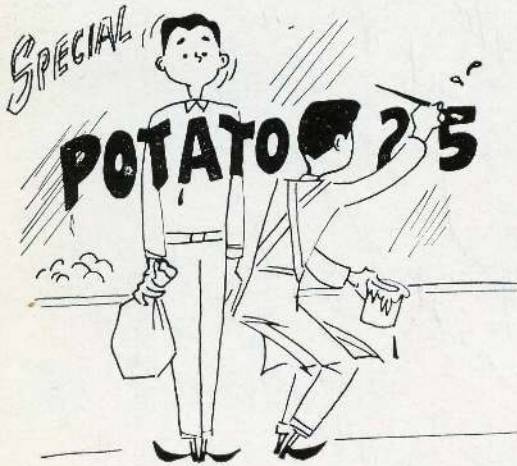

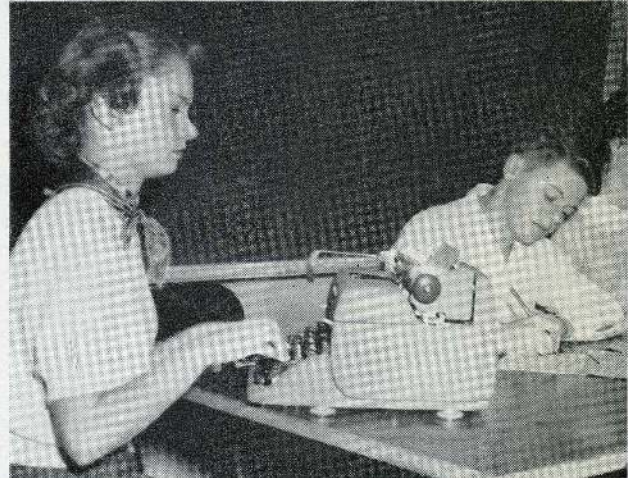

Harry Planck led the squad as high-point man with a league total of 173 tallies, and wound up with 386 for his season's total.

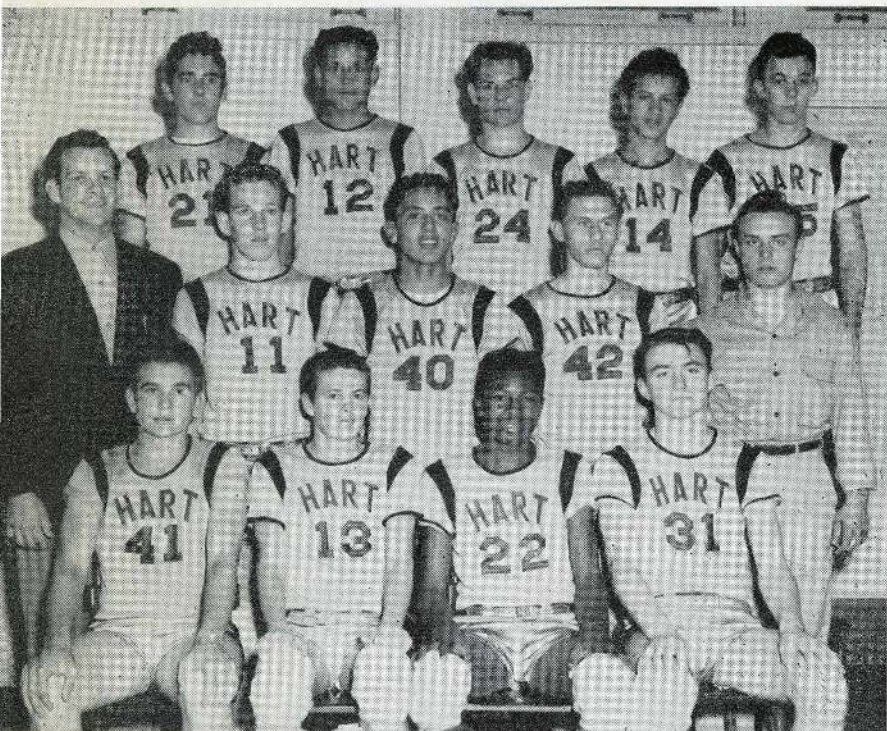

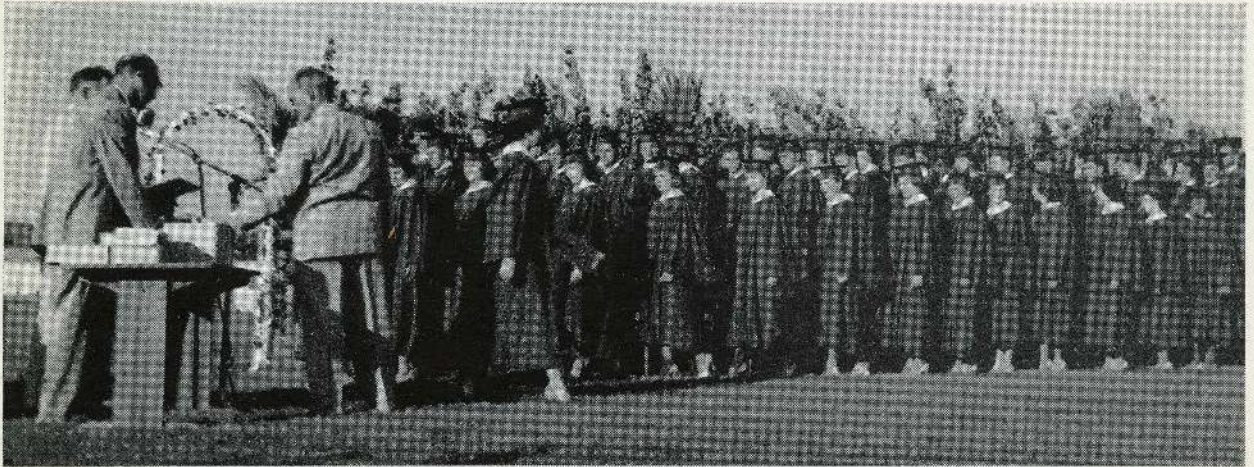

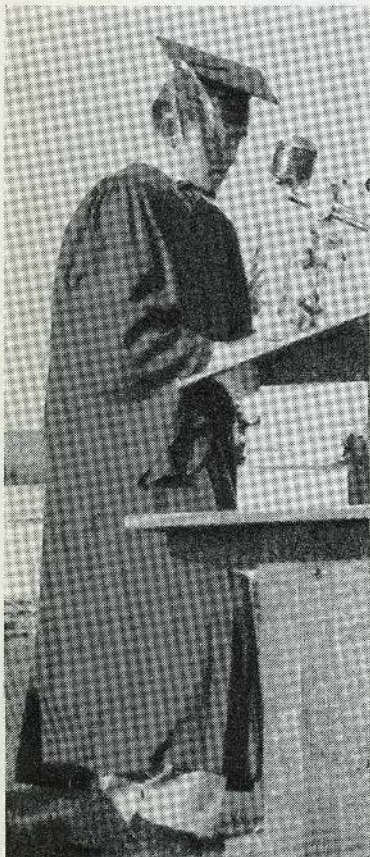

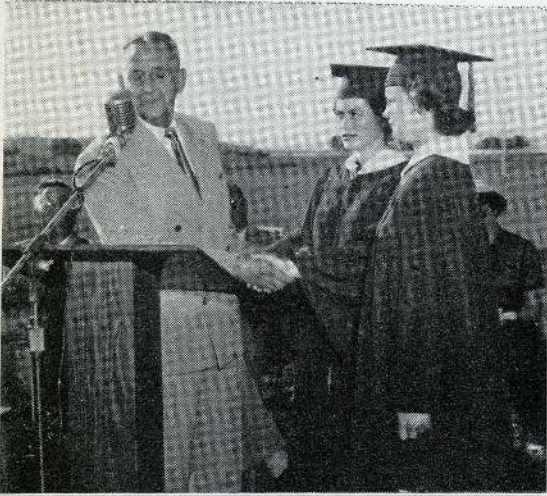

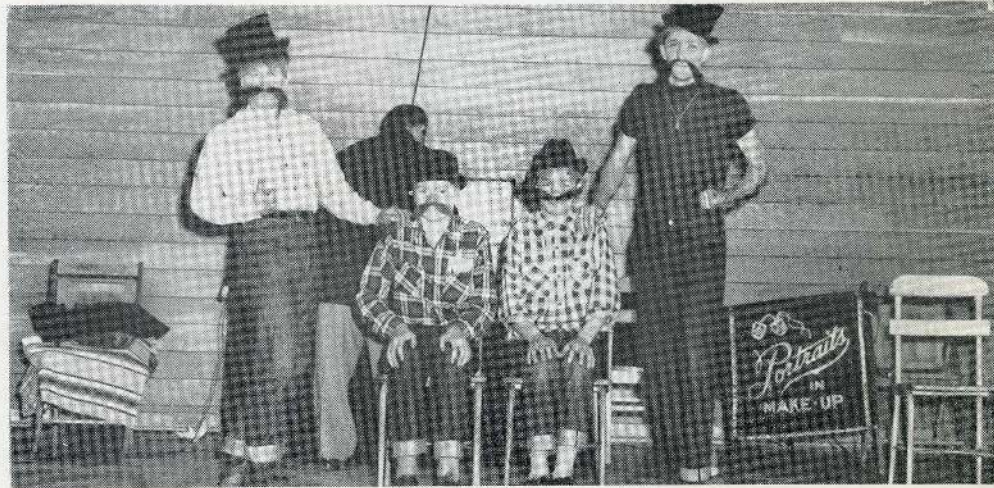
