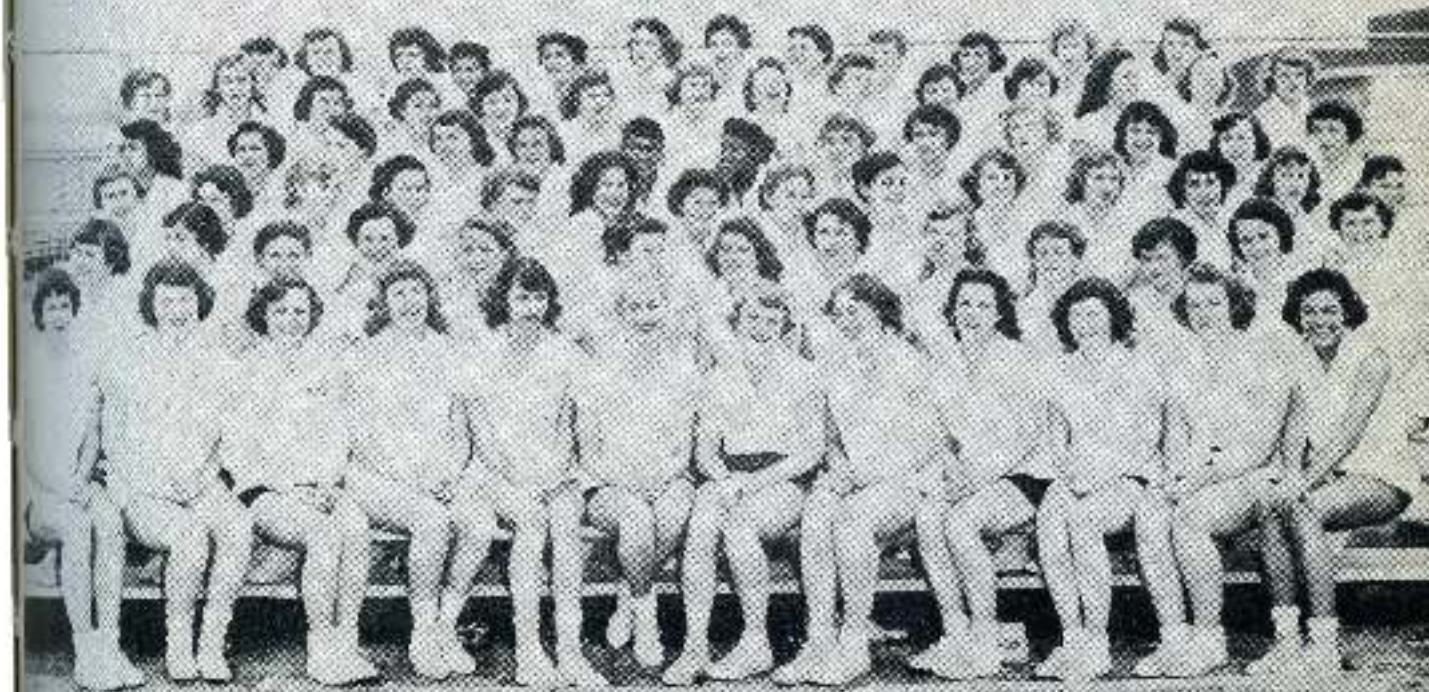

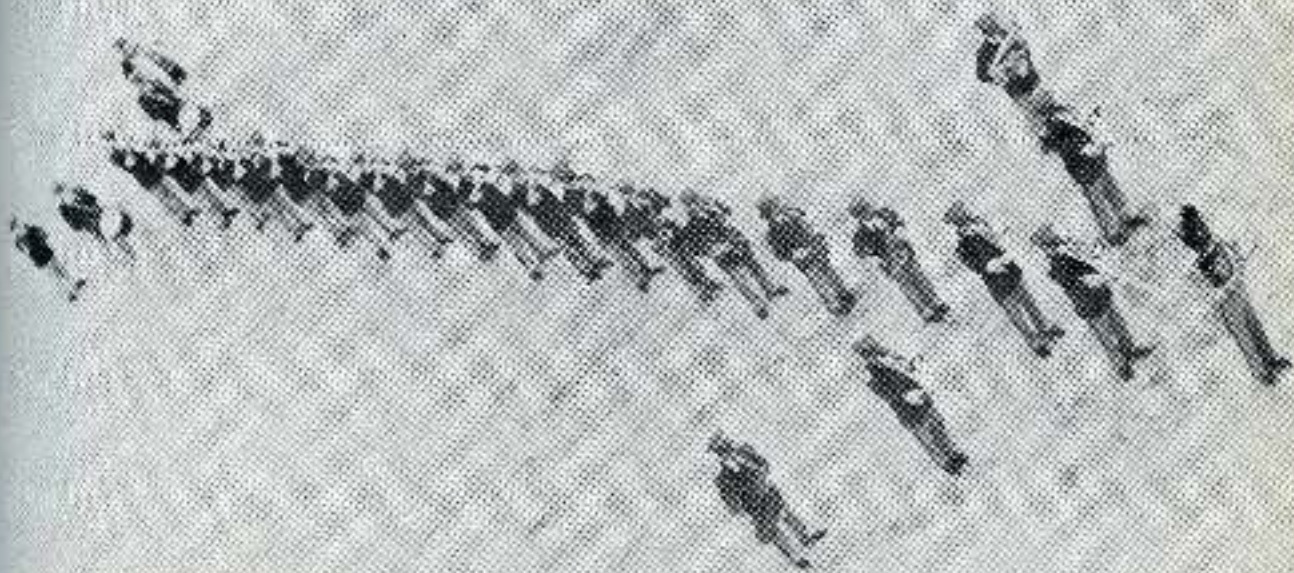


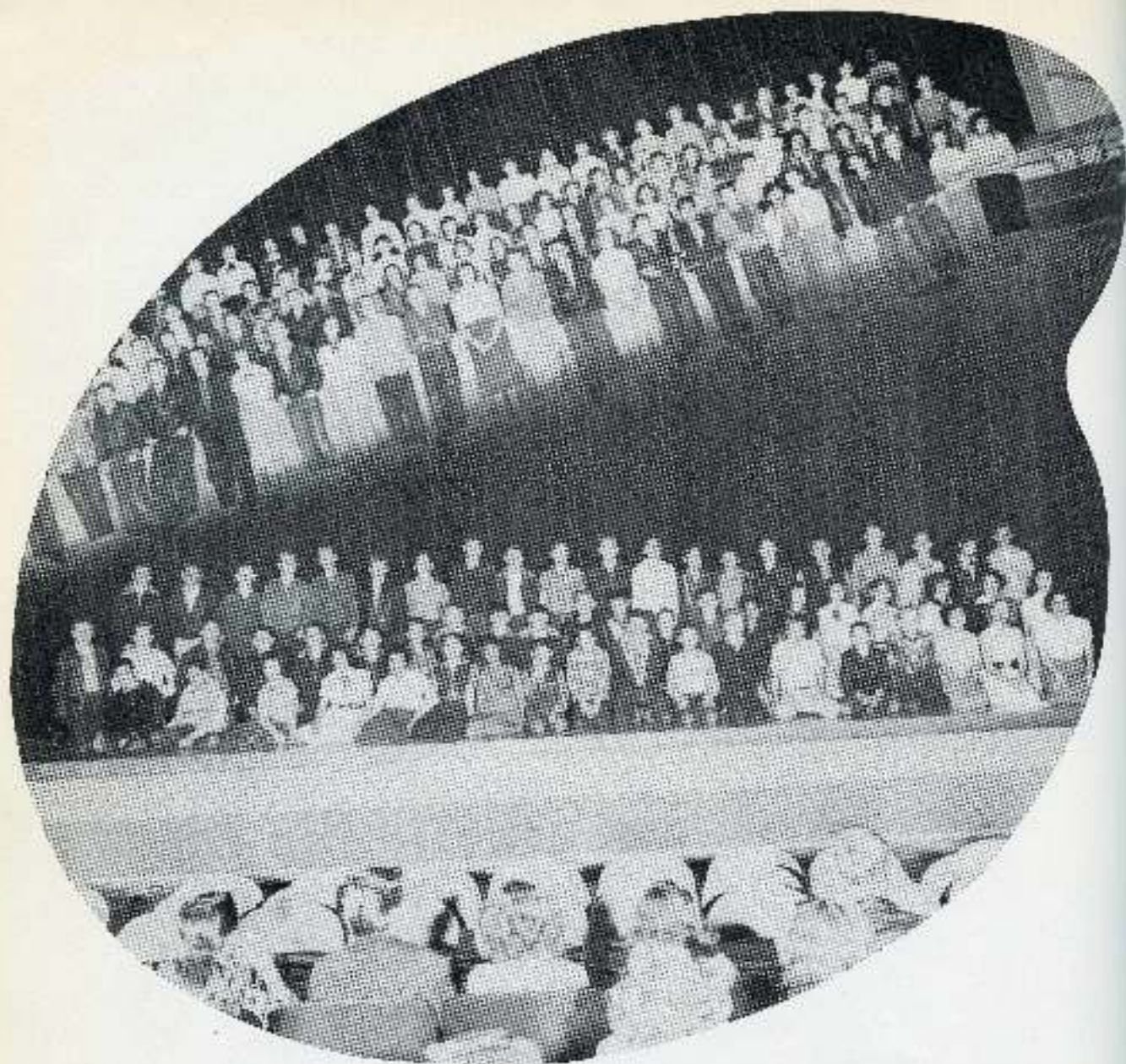
# Swing Time

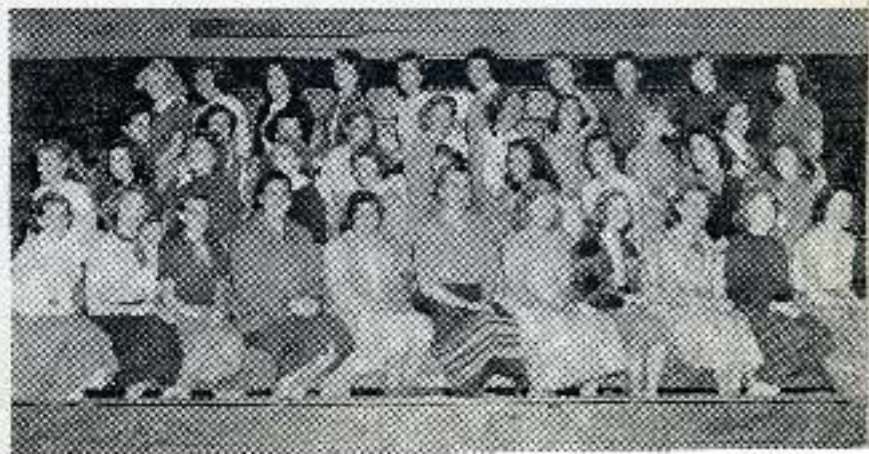


# High Organizations

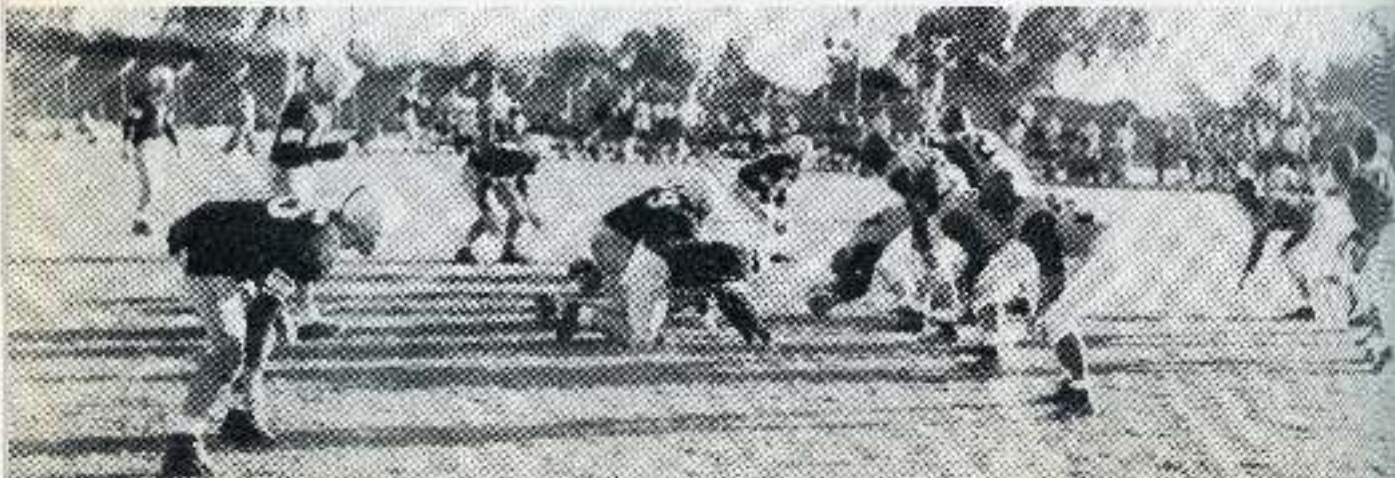

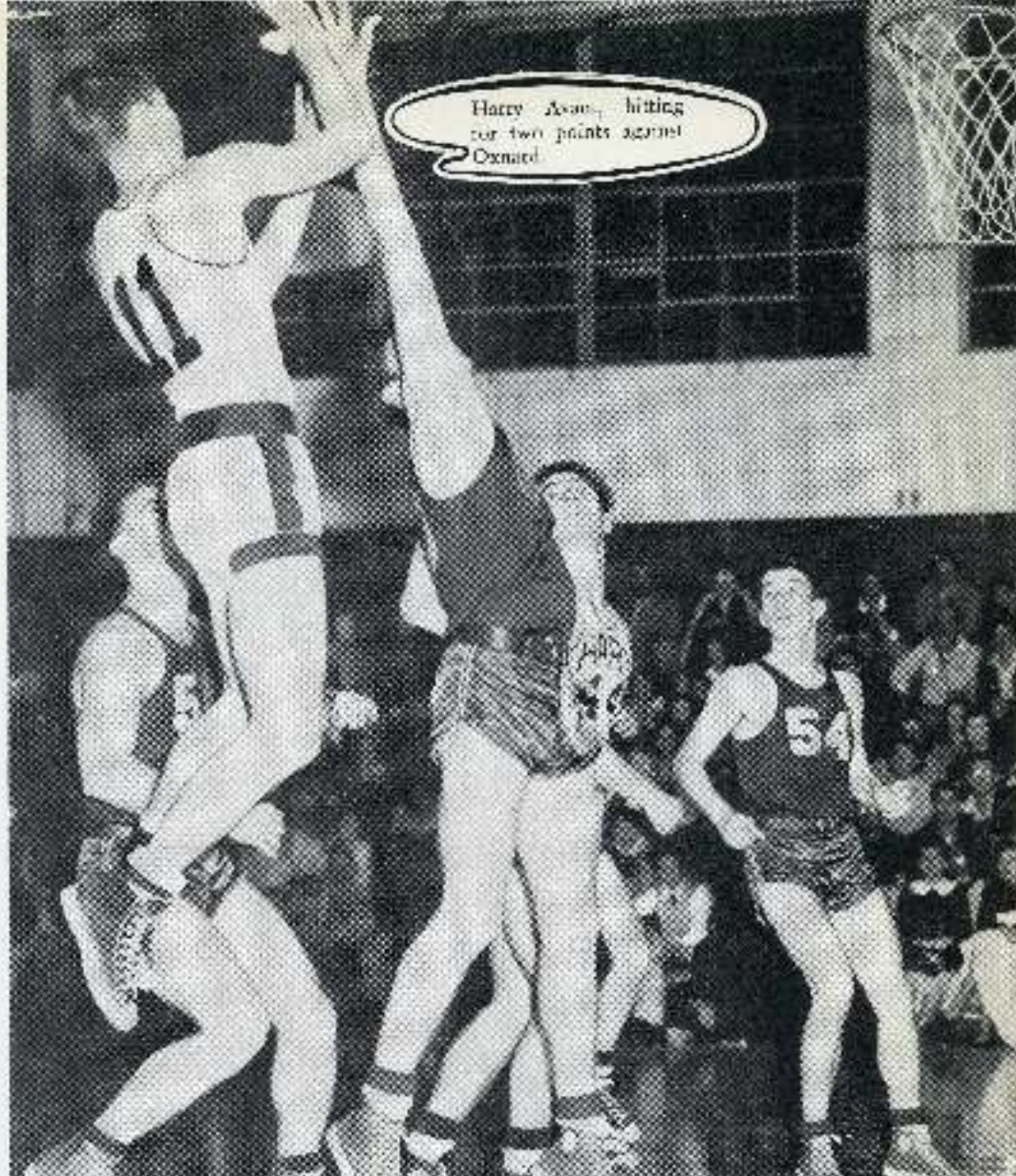

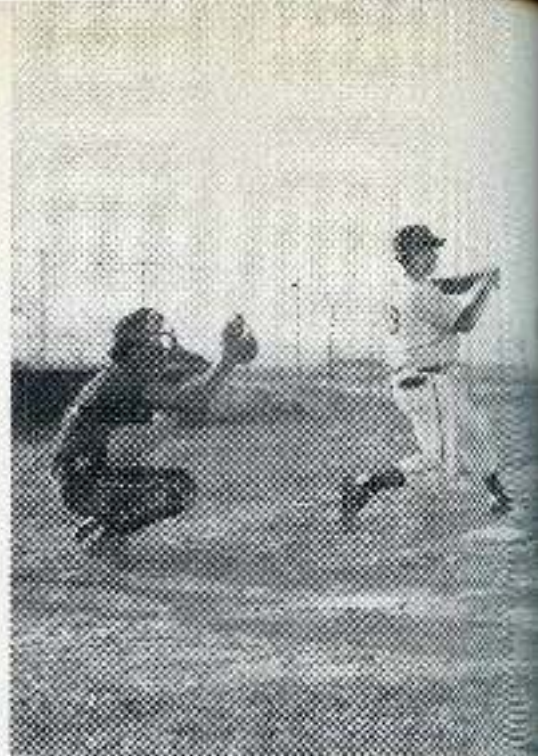

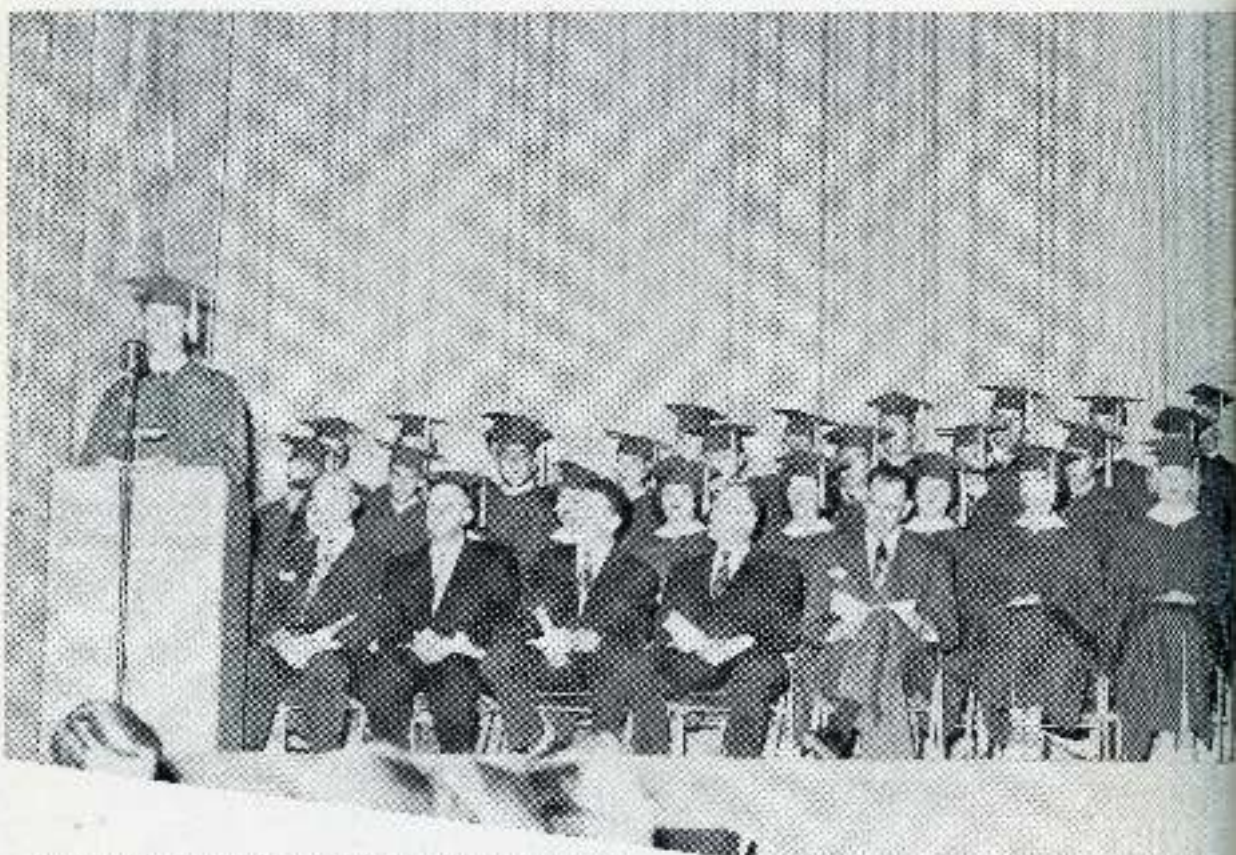
