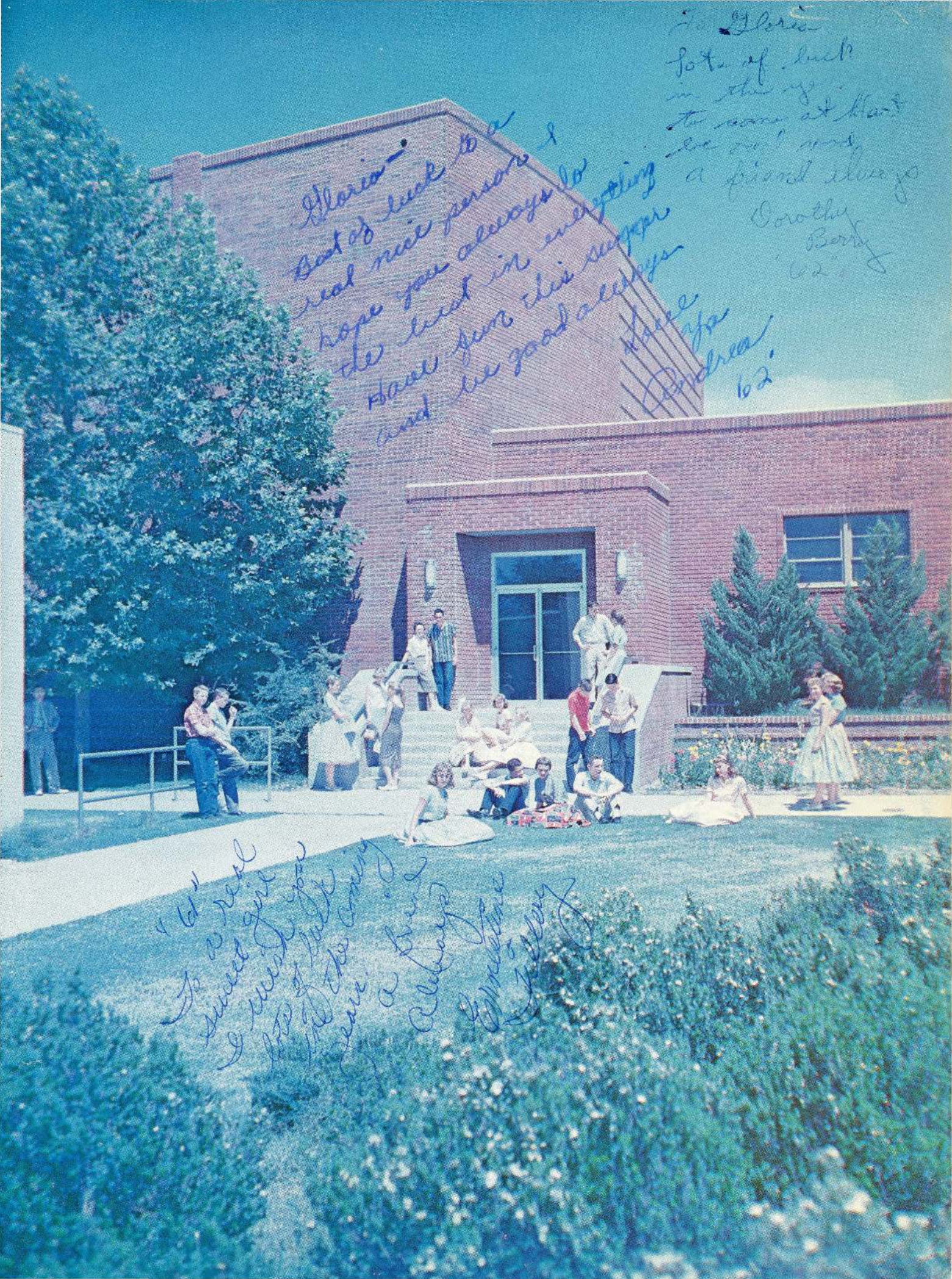

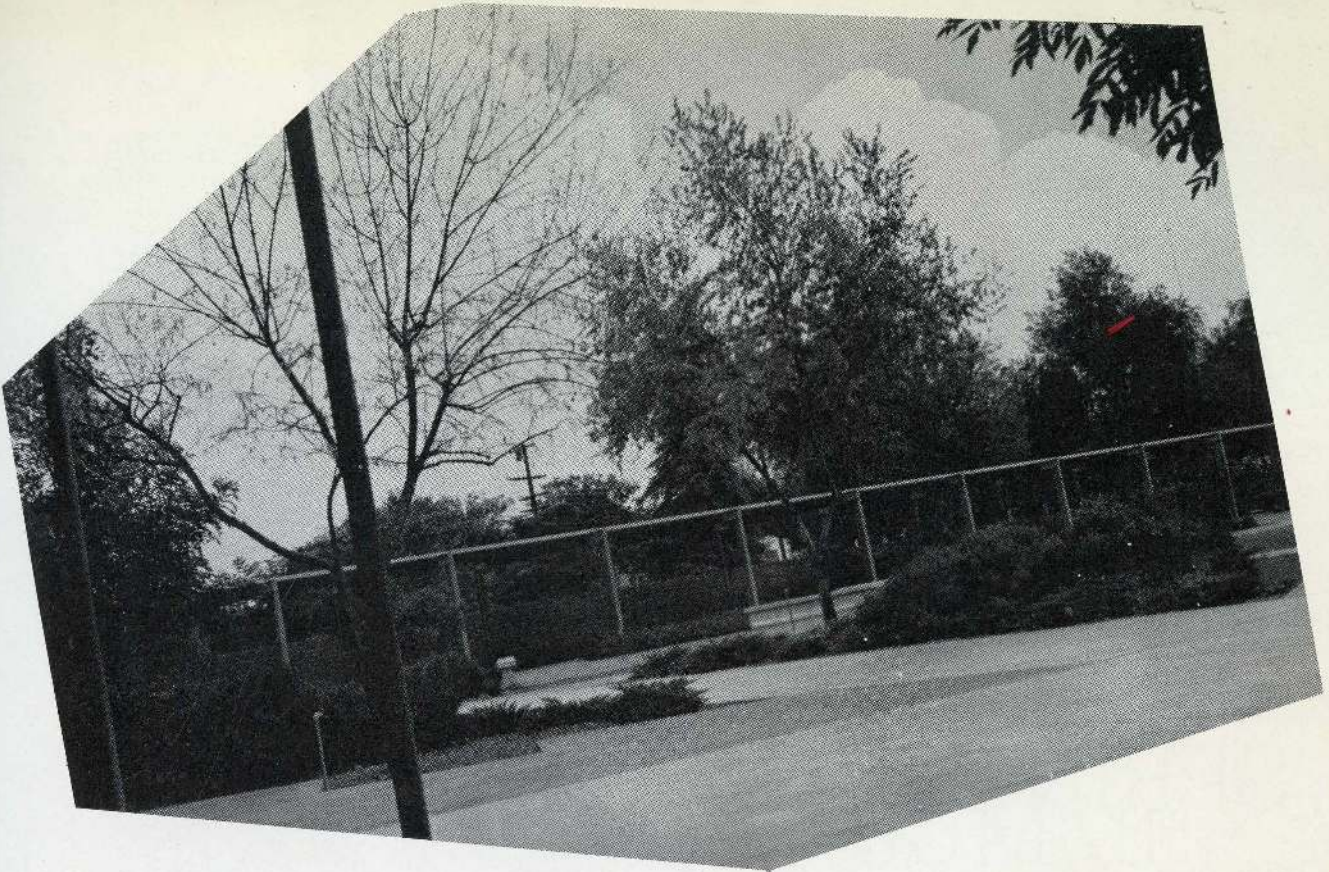
## DEDICATION

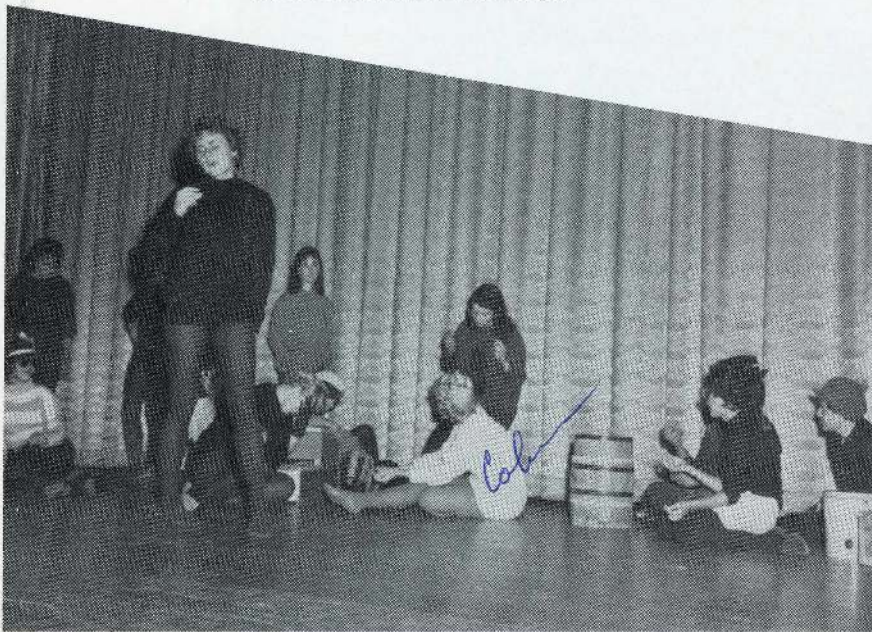
Establishing a criteria for the girls on campus is the main purpose of the National Girls' League Unit at Hart. In this club the girls get a chance to serve their school and community.

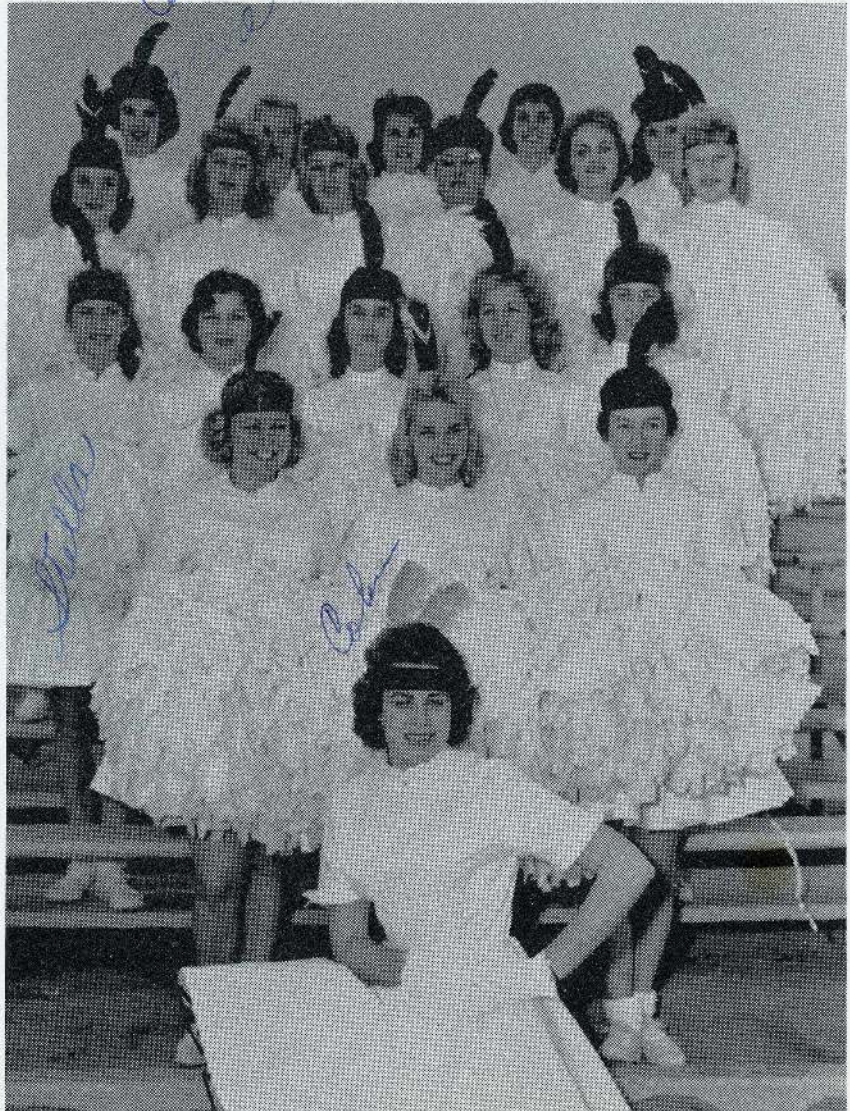


## DRILL TEAM
