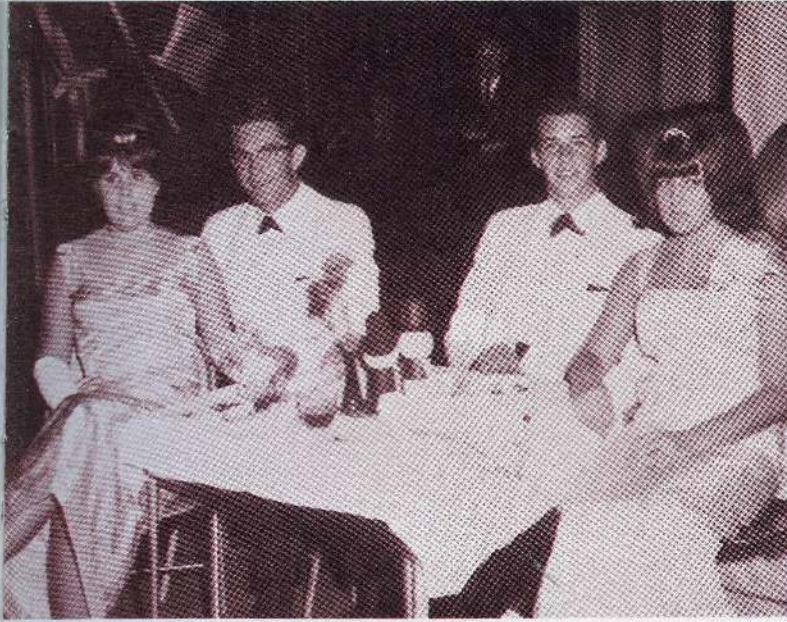

Seniors Picnic; Graduate

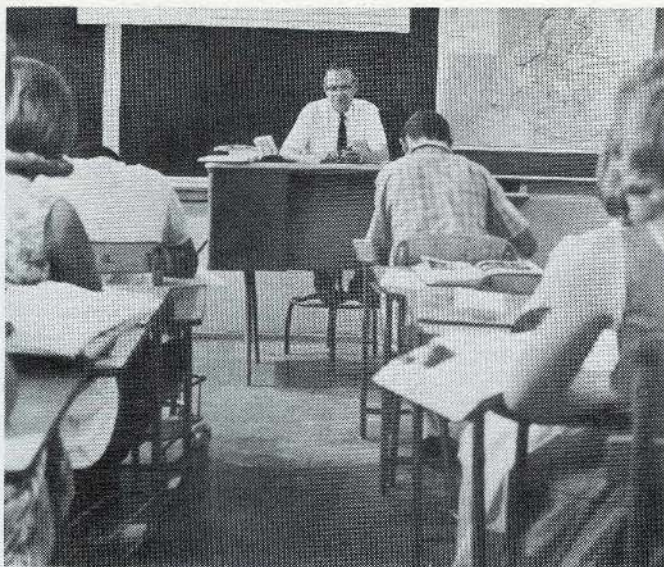
Some played volleyball, others including Bill Pierce, Sharon Hughes and sponsors George Harris and Robert Moore sampled picnic food.

Seniors passed honor chain to juniors symbolic of academic leadership as school year closed.



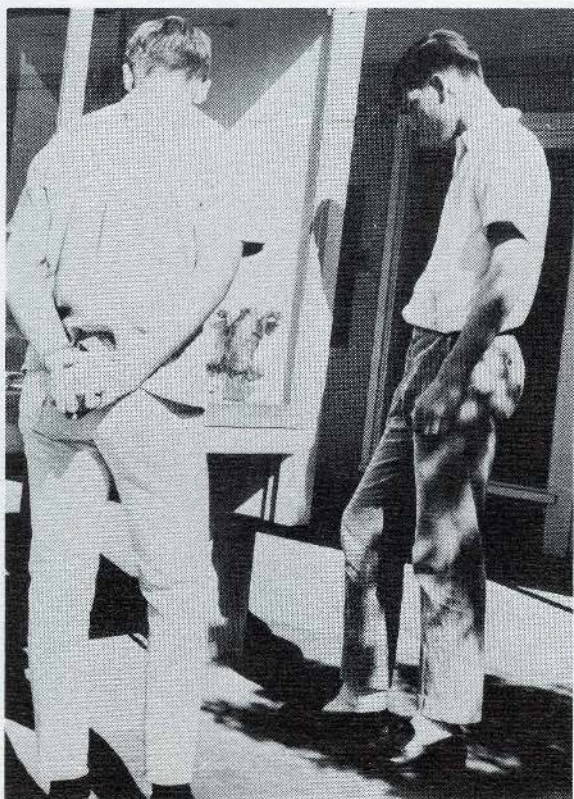

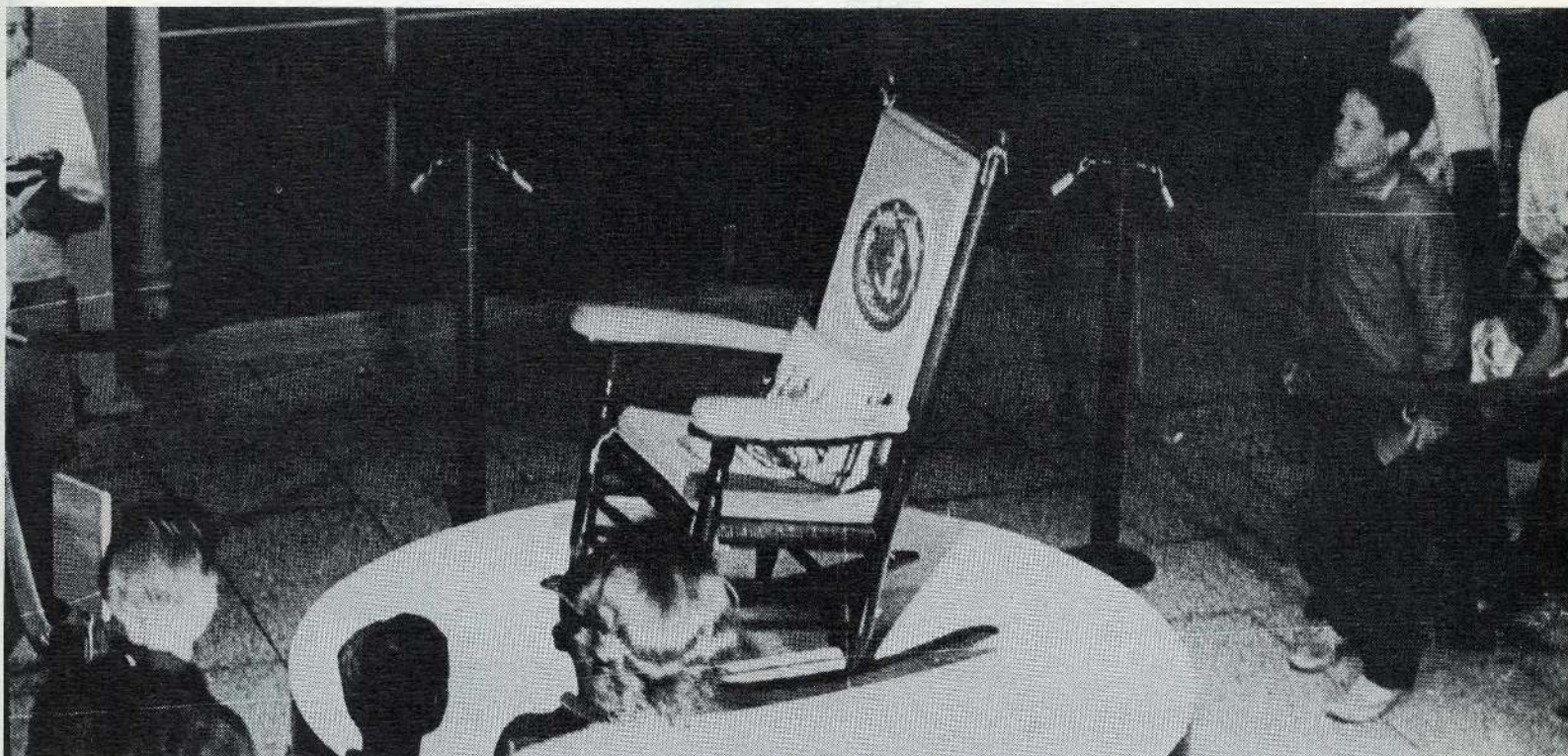

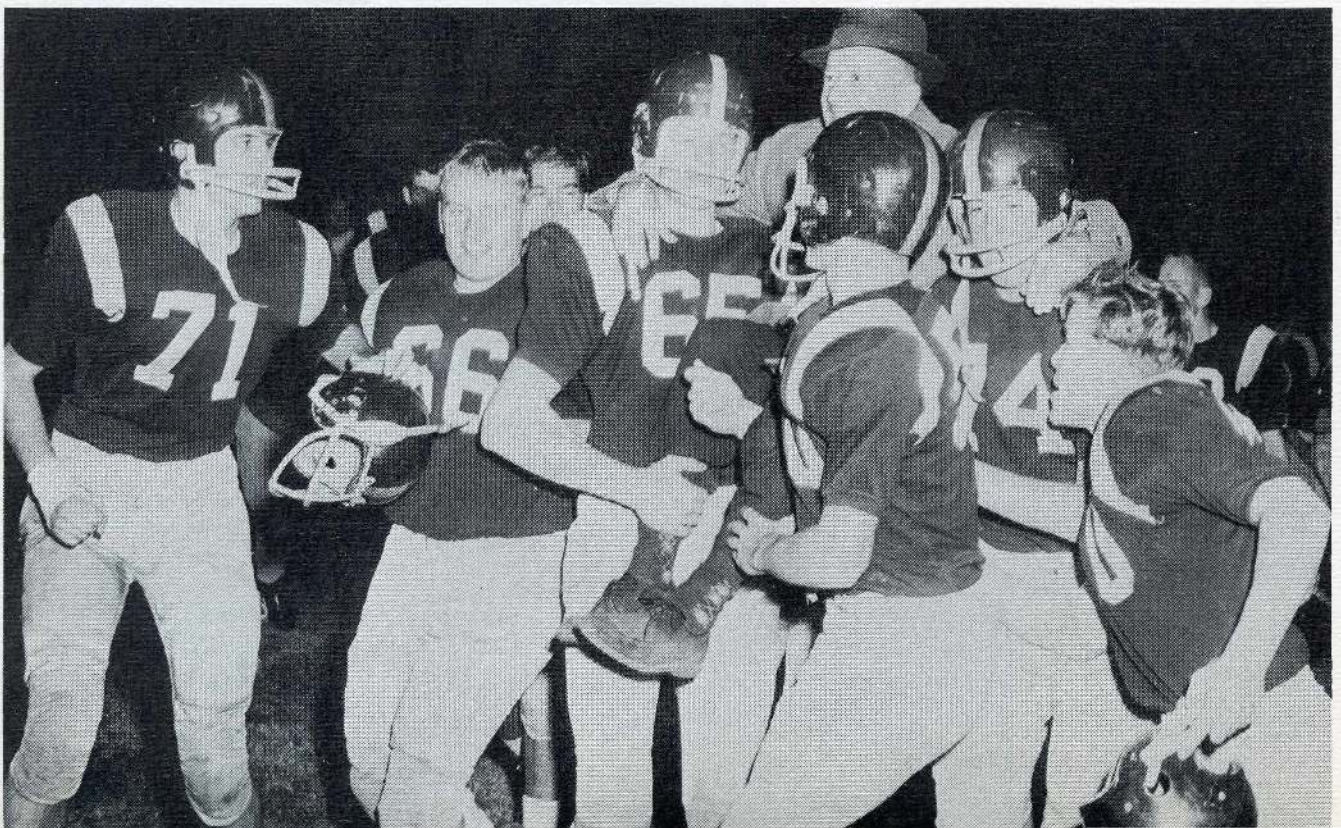

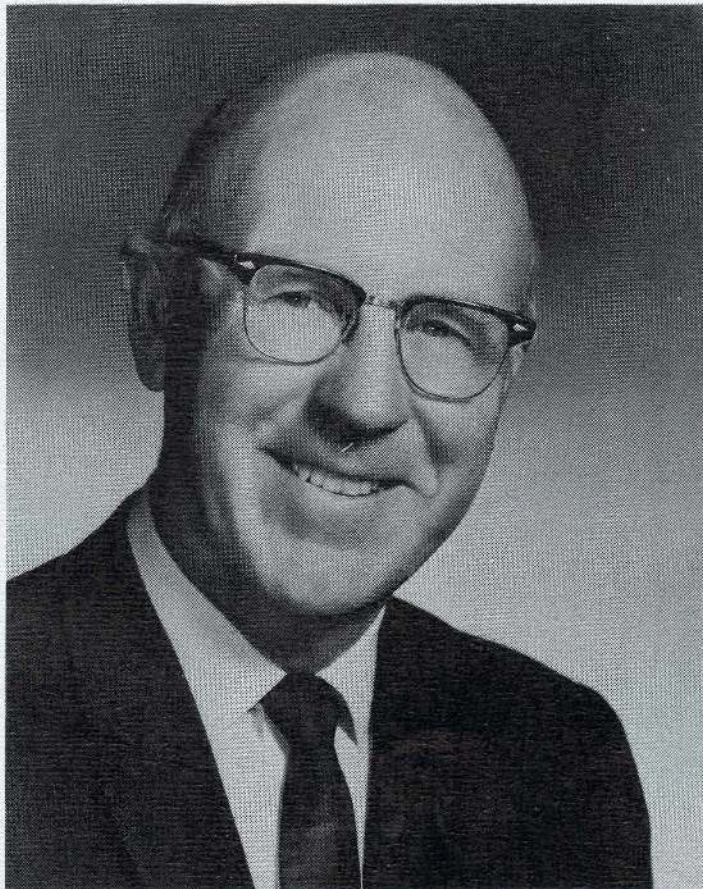

The Tomahawk has produced a yearbook covering the activities of the 1964-65 school year. We have made an effort to portray as many of the events as possible.

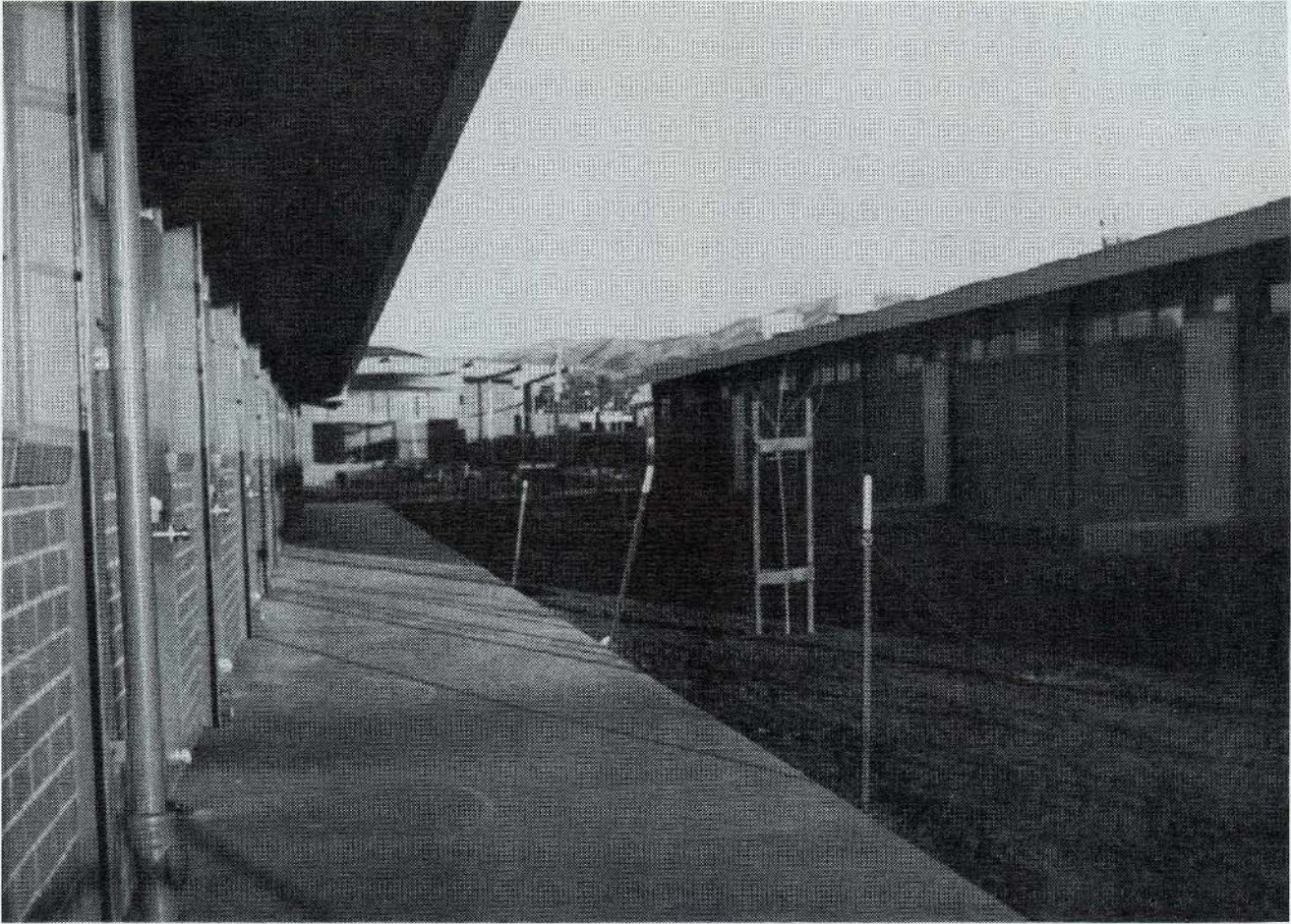
To our advisor Mr. Ed Murdock, who guided us over many rough spots on his own time, I would like to extend the appreciation of the staff.
