#### SCV Historical Society Board of Directors Meeting January 25, 2010

Call to Order

President Alan Pollock called the meeting to order at 6:45 PM.

Present: Cathie Kincheloe, Duane Harte, Jeff Boultinghouse, Laurene Weste, Cathy Martin, Barbara Martinelli and Alan Pollack.

Absent: Nancy Cordova, Sue Yurosek, Kristyn Van Wy, and EJ Stephens

Carol Rock came to discuss the Dam Tour on March 13, 2010 the history of the Dam and what the tour will cover is from 11:00 to 12 noon, with the tour following. The city is no longer able to provide the buses due to Federal regulations regarding buses that are city owned. Carol has investigated private tour companies, the AV Express will do it for about \$660 she is going to see if she can get them talked down. The board will need to make a decision on how to handle the expense of the bus. The tour is a good source of revenue; Carol will contact Alan and Laurene of the answer.

Frank Rock receives 20% of the ticket sale now we have that addition of \$660 for the bus. Publicity will be beginning in February.

Laurene moved to approve the \$660 for the expense of the bus, Jeff second. Motion carried.

Chuck Wagon Western Entertainment Night is April 22 this is the 5<sup>th</sup> year we have partnered with the City. The entertainment this year is Sons & Brothers a 5-person an up and coming group. There is a link on our website, their fee is \$5,000, but Carol got them down to \$1,000, we provide the five hotel rooms for Thur. night at the City rate. Same chuck wagon cooks as last year. Forty tickets have been sold. A sound system will be required; Carol has found someone who will do it for transportation expenses of \$500.00. One sponsor for the lighting the same fellow as last year T & T Lighting Tim Christianson. Also, need two rooms for the cooks. Carole is hoping that we can get two rooms free from the city.

Norm will work out the cost of parking. Carol asked if the Board would attend because it is a very positive. Cathy asked about the liquor expense, we lost money last year because of the insurance. Discussion followed. Carol will send an e-mail to Alan and he can share with the board. Laurene asked what the ticket price is, \$40.00. We could have 200 people here. Advertising was discussed. Expenses so far are \$2,950 not including the cost of soda and alcohol.

Scott Spivey came for the discussion of the Haunt stating that one out of four who attended the Haunt was from out of town. The publicity worked.

Norm discussed the trailers. The park is concerned about the trailers that are using for storage for the Haunt and our things. The trailers have never been part of the contract they are only temporary. Norm discussed the contract. Norm provided a map of our area the map is attached and made a part of these minutes. A decision has to be made about what to do with the trailers. Jeff answered some of Norm's concerns. Discussion regarding the County Contract followed. Jeff and Alan have been negotiating with the county on the contract. Norm pointed out the gray area on the map are buildings that are approved. Discussion followed. The old contract does not allow for trailers. The board would need to send notice to the county asking if the trailers could stay and be made permanent and safe from earthquakes. Scott asked if Norm thought they would look better with sides or facades so they looked like buildings. Norm stated that something would need to be put into writing regarding what action would be taken. Barbara asked if the trailers could be moved and taken out and bought back when needed. Laurene suggested a

Cargo container might be a solution, better looking and could be permanent.

Norm furthered reported that some trees fell and had to be removed. There is no water in the campground so it cannot be used right now. When the county repairs the water line, they could do a sewer if we provided the materials. Norm asked Alan to send him an e-mail with what the Historical Society Board wants to do and he will see what can be done to take it to the county and work toward getting the contract negotiations moving again.

Laurene asked Norm which road alignment would be used.

Question to Scott are they planning to do the Haunt. He said that they are having some difficulties in keeping the group together.

The two trailers that the Haunt uses are mobile, one of the trailers that the Haunt used could be moved but the old one cannot. Scott said this year they are planning to scale back on the size of the Haunt. The dance company wants to come back as does the pirate and the hayride. This would probably help in the storage department. Discussion followed. Options were brought up to expand the daytime events associated with the Haunt. Scott wants to drop the school group. He has no problem getting volunteers. Scott said he would support what will be done with the trailers. Scott said he has contact for big rigs to move the trailers.

#### **Board of Directors Meeting**

February 22, 2010

#### Call to Order:

President Alan Pollack called the meeting to order at 6:35 PM with the following board members present: Sue Yurosek, Cathy Martin, Jeff Boultinghouse, Alan Pollack, Duane Harte, Barbara Martinelli, John Boston, Nancy Cordova, Laurene Weste, and Pat Saletore, Executive Director. Sioux Coghlan was excused because she is in the hospital. E.J. Stephens had a scheduling conflict. Visitors Norm Phillips and Kimel Conway were introduced and allowed to speak before the rest of the agenda.

kimel Conway asked for comments or questions about the delayed contract agreement pending the between the Historical Society and L.A. County Parks. He noted that it had been some timesince he had seen any of us because other contracts had taken precedence, but now it was again being considered. The temporary document that we had negotiated was only a precursor to the final document. The document as we negotiated will return with any changes that the County Counsel has added for our consideration.

They expect to have this settled by the time the temporary agreement runs out this June.

He also offered a compromise on the disposition of the **truck trailers** used by the Haunt and the Society for storage. They would allow us to move them to another place onsite to get them out of the street side view.

Jeff Boultinghouse moved to approve the January 25, 2010 minutes, Laurene Weste seconded and the motion carried.

Nancy Cordova noted that all correspondence was up to date, but that she didn't have a list available.

Treasurers report was presented a copy is attached and made a part of these minutes. Some discussion ensued on the cost of the Chuckwagon event. It was noted that we had not yet received a budget from

organizer Carol Rock. Questions were raised about the value of the event. Laurene Weste urged the Board to promote the sales of tickets and there would be more profit. Alan Pollack also noted that as long as it wasn't losing any money, it was a benefit to draw people to our site. Laurene also suggested special rates for Chuckwagon tickets from April 16<sup>th</sup> till the 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Jeff Boultinghouse reported **Membership** letters went out and replies are coming back. Duane Harte noted that the membership letters have paid off. Jeff and Pat Saletore mentioned that the addresses are being worked on for another mailing targeting more people for donations. It was also noted that a mass email for people on Alan's programs list would be sent out about joining as members as well. Laurene West suggested we give out copies of the "Day in the Life" books with every membership.

Cathy Martin reported that she had sold over \$700 from the **gift shop.** Duane Harte also commented that she had spent \$900 at the LA Gift Show. It was agreed that things were going fairly well and that Cathy was gearing up for the Cowboy festival.

Barbara Martinelli reported that **School Tours** season has begun. The Questers have turned out in force for the first few tours and it seems very possible that they will come for all tours, since there will be fewer due to reduced funding for busses.

Sue presented a brief **Restoration Report** noting that she had finally contacted the painter for the Saugus Station and will have a quote after a meeting this Saturday at 8:30 am. Bids are being taken by the Questers to repaint at least portions of the Edison House which is peeling badly on the South East side.

#### Programs:

Discussion about the St. Francis Dam Tour brought up the idea that perhaps we should not have it every year. Some Board Members questioned the need to pay Frank Rock 20% of the receipts. Our return on the event will be much less now that we have to pay for the busses. But it was ultimately agreed that because the community expected the trip that even though we were not making any money on the event, that we should continue it.

Sue Yurosek announced that the Annual Tea was scheduled for April 10<sup>th</sup> and that she was going to charge \$30. The program, to be given again by Nancy Cordova, was set to be on Jadite.

Cathy Martin announced that due to the cost and inability to use the Freight room for the **Tequila Tasting**, she was not going to have it with the Chuckwagon Dinner. She also noted that it had gone out in the City's Cowboy Festival brochure that it would without any communication with her.

#### **Old Business:**

Pat Saletore noted that she had few responses to the release/agreement confirming the ability of the Board to have **Electronic**Voting via email or telephone. Barbara Martinelli requested that we have hardcopy at the next meeting for convenient signing.

#### **New Business:**

Laurene Weste noted that City staff had recently seen previously unknown photos of the **Pioneer Oil Refinery** before the 1971 and 1994 earthquake damage. She related that for the first time, they realized how attractive the site could be, if repaired.

Executive Director Pat Saletore reported that she is getting more volunteers working in the gardens and that she had **planted some native sages** and related plants in front of the Station. She is planning to work up information for docents to talk about the uses and attributes of these plants for the historical Native American population.

She also noted that the **Museum Relocation committee** had met at Sue Yurosek's hous on Saturday and made some great progress. She also reported that she and Scott Sivley had met earlier in the afternoon with Norm Phillips to discuss the **Haunt plans**. Things seem to be agreeable to all at this point.

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Another new development Pat reported was a COC intern whose project was to call all the people with phone numbers in the Past Perfect Database and check on the condition of our information. This would result in a much cleaner list of people to mail to in the Summer.

Adjournment:

Jeff Boultinghouse moved and Sue Yurosek seconded to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 8:21 PM

Norm Phillips spoke and stated the trailers must go from the junction. The county has a problem with any trailers on the property for liability reasons.

Ralph Nazarian, the tractor driver will be here on Saturday, March 27, 2010 to oversee project. On Thursday, March 25, 2010 Jerry Malarari will come to the junction to check the water pipe and sewer line that is bubbling up in the back lot. He will talk with the Historical Society to determine when the project can begin. There needs to be an alignment of the system. A line will be put in and a line will be dropped separating the line from the hydrant and it should not be on our meter. Jeff Boultinghouse wanted to know if an electric line can be put in at the same time the sewer line is put in.

Liability insurance was discussed and noted the Historical Society carries insurance. Nancy Cordova will contact the 5th district to see if there can be a change to the liability. Discussion of a cargo bin, a 20 ft. out of Long Beach is roughly \$2,200, a 40 footer would be more money. Would the 40 footer be fine for what we need? Could a barn be built? Currently, the materials would probably be more than a cargo bin.

The foundation 501c3 profit loss statement form for the county needs to be submitted.

The sewer project will not affect the school tours; docents will work with the schedule during school scheduled tours.

Is realignment of the road to be considered? Need to make sure the pipe does not go through a building, the erosion from the tracks needs to be looked at due to the erosion, the dirt by the track, we cannot do the pipe with the trailers, cannot open the camp ground without the water, working with the county to put the county line in the back there will be a two and four inch line

for the pipe.

**Correspondence Report:** Nancy Cordova will send out thank you cards for monies sent into the SCV Historical Society.

**Treasurer's Report:** Duane Harte discussed the report and statements are attached with these minutes. (See attached report)

Introduction of Guests: Norm Phillips, Scott Sivley, Santa Clarita Model Train Club

Santa Clarita Model Train Club member Steve Kerr and with other club members spoke about the possibility of a model layout of the baggage and express room of the SCV train station, the model would be incorporated into the original station. Steve would like an historical model of the Soledad Cyn. line from Santa Clarita to Lancaster constructed for the early years of existence, by using San Juan maps to the actual route of the station for the early history of SCV. The club would like to be a part of the SCV historical society and become a society within the SCV historical society, all members would be part of the society and help support the club activities, by getting families and young involved in the making of the modeling of the trains layout and the operations of the trains within the model railroad. People in the club would show the railroad history by becoming docent in the SCV historical society. The time frame for this project is project to a year or two depending on the moving of the museum and gift shop to the Pardee House. Research for this project will take some time to get data and information about the layout. Need to look at corporate charter 301c to see if the proposal is possible in the historical society. Train club does not want to be separate from the SCV Historical Society. (See proposal attached to agenda)

# Norm Phillips Presentation

Contract with the county (see attachment of documents enclosed) please look at the draft and note changes, Norm would like to reconvene in a few weeks to compare with the original document by way of the internet.

Pat Saletore and Norm Phillips are battling for the sewer permit fees and are hoping for reduction of fees from Newhall Water Co. to get a sewer system into the park.

Scott Sivley discussed the monies being used for the haunt, Scott would prefer a better system of following of the money to the SCV Historical Society, and he would prefer to have the money

channeled directly to the SCV Historical Society. He is concerned about the funds projected for the upcoming haunt in Oct. 2010. Scott would like monies to be directed by the Historical Society to be taken care of members who will follow the procedures of use for the Haunt and therefore have the money and procedure of Haunt to be approved ahead of time by the committee. Scott gave an example of vouchers being used to get approval of items being spent for the haunt. SueYurosek requested the Pardee House not be used to store Haunt materials. The Questers are assisting with the restorations of the Pardee House, and since the Questers have committed to helping with the house they do not need to be confronted with the details of the Haunt. Scott is working on getting volunteers for the haunt and will accommodate the request made by Sue Yurosek.

Scott is working on the entrance of the Haunt, he will be changing the flow line around to get people through the Haunt at a quicker pace. He is planning on having a magician, a maze graveyard, more actors, Alice and Scary Wonderland, photos, a pirate village and a hayride to campground 7 to see other scary things within the perimeter of the SCV Historical Society. Major concern last year was Building and Safety almost stopped the production of the haunt, need to follow the given guideline for 2010.

John Boston spoke about the Hollywood Sign being an identifying icon, he spoke about the possibility of a sign that puts the station on the map, needs to conform to the city specks.

Alan Pollack spoke about the need to get people to the station to discuss plans for upcoming events for the Historical Society. The society needs to start with an advisory board, make a fund raising plan; also get to know more movers and shakers – ask for ideas. Several suggestions were made and discussion of the December Christmas event, an activity for each of the houses and what else could be accomplished to bring others into our society. A suggestion to members to make a commitment for proposed opportunities to begin fund raising, and another suggestion of the need for a a sub committee to plan on ways to get the committee off the ground.

Correspondence Report: A pick and play Blue Grass Band, has been suggested for the Haunt.

**Treasurer's Report:** Duane Harte reported for March \$15,000 loss of expenses on the paint job of the station and that was for the month, the actual loss was \$200.00

Not all bills and receipts for the Chuckwagon dinner are in yet, but it will result in an overall loss. Sold approximately 70 to 120 people for the event, had we sold all the tickets we would have been squelched due to the weather. A SCV fireman made a spot check while the event took place. Duane suggested a committee for the event. Carol did take care of all the items that needed to be taken care of for the event. Another suggestion of setting a budget and analyzing the amount at a reasonable rate, we will not sell all of the two hundred tickets. A discussion was made on continuing the Chuckwagon dinner. Jeff stated that Duane was correct that we would lose money on this event.

**Membership Report:** For the 2010 year, the current membership within the society is approximately even with the previous year, (2009) of people who have sponsored money to the Historical Society. Pat Saletore will ask an intern to focus on calling membership applications and hopefully get members to sponsor back into the Historical Society. Jeff Boultinghouse feels sending membership applications out after Christmas was a good idea since the society received a better response.

**School Tours Report:** Barbara Martinelli spoke about school tours and the interest of the Quester, they are excited about the school tours and highly supportive. There are 23 more classes scheduled and bus tours with five classes in June. Barbara presented letter generated by students in Ruthann Murthy third grade class who previously visited the station.

**Gift Shop Report:** Cathy Martin spoke, she was happy about the results of the gift shop income made at the Cowboy Festival, Saturday was a great day, and a total income of \$2,528 in three days was accumulated for the event. She would like to send a thank you to Diane Vradenberg for her assistance with the festival. Diane sold all of the <u>Newhall Books</u>, still needs to pay for other books outstanding.

# SANTA CLARITA VALLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY 2011-2012 CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

#### **CAMPAIGN "KICK-OFF" EVENT**

The Santa Clarita Valley Historical Society plans to launch a Capital Campaign in January 2011 to raise \$200,000. The kick-off of this campaign will begin with the unveiling of the Santa Clarita Valley Historical Society/Old Town Newhall Walking Tour Project. This town-wide project, produced on a relatively modest budget and scale will be provide a new attraction for Newhall and the Historical Society and the opening day event and festivities will provide the high-profile stage for introducing the 2011 Capital Campaign. The walking tour includes new signage, media and will provide a cultural attraction for the Historical Society and town of Newhall. In addition, the project will focus attention on the importance and prevalence of the historical assets in the community and reinforce the need for historic preservation, education, and community outreach. Completing this tour will bring attention and provide impetus for implementing the Capital Campaign Project. An attached proposal summarizes the Walking Tour Project scheduled for completion by first quarter, 2011.

#### THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

The Capital Campaign, scheduled to begin first quarter 2011, focuses on two important priorities for the Historical Society: Restoration, and Interpretation.

RESTORATION: Campaign Goal: \$100,000 These funds will be used to restore and maintain the Pardee House in Heritage Junction. The restoration project includes the creation of a museum facility within this historic building.

INTERPRETATION: Campaign Goal: \$100,000. These funds will be used to design the museum contents and tell the story of the Santa Clarita Valley. The project will include defining significant themes, important characters and relating the story of the Santa Clarita Valley in terms of the larger story of the American West. Includes the creation of signage, interactive displays, video and history center.

# Methods of implementation:

- First Quarter 2011 Kick-Off Event with Newhall Walking Tour Opening Ceremony and Celebration.
- Create a permanent 2010 Capital Campaign donors page on the <u>scvhs.org</u> website with acknowledgment for various levels of donation. Perhaps each level of donation can have some honorable name attached to it (i.e.-Platinum level, gold level, silver level, etc.).

- On home page of <u>scvhs.org</u> website, create permanent link to donors page and set up thermometer to monitor progress towards campaign goal of \$200.000.
- Send notice to all members of Society and all of our email lists with invitation to donate to campaign and explain rewards for various levels of donation.
- Send out letters to likely business and corporate donors in the community explaining the campaign and soliciting donations.
- Media campaign to explain campaign and solicit donations from the community.

#### Honors available for donors:

- \$5, \$10, \$25, \$50, \$100: Honorable mention in the Heritage Junction Dispatch newsletter and permanent listing on donor page on website
- \$250: All of above, plus name on brick to be part of a Brick "Walk of Fame" in Heritage Junction (or cement with stars, etc.). Walk of fame to be placed on the ground in front of the new museum and possibly in front of the Train Station as well depending on the number of donors.
- \$500-\$75,000: All of above, plus name placed on plaque on "Donor Wall of Fame" in new museum in Pardee House (perhaps in the reading room) with recognition of various levels of donation.
- \$100,000 and above: All of first 3 levels of honors, plus name placed in prominent location on outside of building at entrance to the new museum in the Pardee House as a principle sponsor and benefactor of the Pardee House and new museum.

#### Possible alternative honors:



#### **Introduction of Guest:**

David Peterson and Alex Hernandez from the city of Santa Clarita brought in documents to discuss historic preservation, the documents have not been formally introduced to the city of SCV, David and Alex brought the papers to the SCV Historical Society to present an up-date as to what classifies historical buildings. David and Alex presented a list of recommended properties as historic sites. Alex presented a proposal part of the ordinance as a draft, (see summary sheet provided) Nomination of historic properties are decided by the committee, a property owner who owns the historical property will be notified of property being a historic designation property. Everything at the junction will be listed as historical property so it cannot be destroyed later on. #2 Alternation of designated historic property, if you want to improve your property you will need certificate of appropriateness, there are a list of things that can be done without the certificate of appropriateness. The public hearing is free, to do the certificate; if you want to demolish or relocate you must go to the city council for purpose. #4 Mills Act gives tax incentives for the property, no entitlement fee, and use historic building code. List of properties already protected on historical list. Do not have legal authority with sites outside city limits which will not be affected by ordinance, they are being tracked however. Check list of sites with city, plagues of historic sites will be mounted.

- Paul Duryea- introduced as possible candidate for SCV Board Member 2011.
   Paul is a 39 year retired, Captain of Detectives with Glendale Police Dept., is was a senior investigator, he received his AA from Glendale, a BA in criminal justice, an USU graduate, currently weed whacks the garden, moves boxes upstairs for the SCVH Society.
- Ed Marg introduced as possible candidate for SCV Board Member 2011. Ed has lived in Santa Clarita since 1967 currently working at SCVH Society for three years with the Halloween Haunt, full time engineer with fiber optics, Ed is ready to move things forward.

- 1. Nomination of Historic Properties:
  - The nomination process can be initiated by one of the following:
    - o The property owner;
    - o The City Council;
    - o The Planning Commission;
    - o The Director of Community Development.
  - For a property to be nominated it must meet specific criteria.
  - All nominations are subject to a public hearing before both the Planning Commission and City Council.
    - o The City Council has ultimate approval authority.
- 2. Alteration of Designated Historic Properties:
  - Exemptions exist for common property maintenance.
  - Significant alteration of historic properties would require a Certificate of Appropriateness.
    - All Certificates of Appropriateness for the significant alteration of historic properties would be subject to a public hearing before the Planning Commission.
- 3. Relocation and/or Demolition of Historic Properties:
  - Relocation and/or demolition of historic properties would require a Certificate of Appropriateness and be subject to a public hearing before the Planning Commission and the City Council.
- 4. Incentives to Property Owners:
  - Mills Act
  - No entitlement fee for Certificate of Appropriateness
  - Use of California Historic Building Code







I have purchased all of the can lighting that will be installed in the next week, as well as the drywall for the kitchen, bathrooms and hallway. The flooring should be done end of next week, and the security camera and sensor wires should be done in 2 -3 weeks with the LAN wiring and additional electrical outlets. I believe the library shelving should be done in two weeks and we should have the painting done in two weeks, possibly three. There is much to do on the exhibit side, and I am unaware of what progress has been accomplished there. We have three display cases that need only some minor cleaning and a quick coat of varnish, I have also checked the Sheep Herders Covered Wagon should be able to get through the door with some disassembly and re-assembly. Modification of the rear door to double wide doors requires expansion of the rear deck and the acquisition of an appropriate door set, so this will not be accomplished by the June deadline. Occupancy certificate requirements from Fire Marshall and Building and safety status; Acquired Lighted exit signs, smoke detectors, battery backup emergency lighting, fire extinguishers and signs. Still need to build Hand Rail on entrance stairs and exit stairs. We have the material for the Hand Rails. We are still confirming PA system components. I will meet with Fire Marshall next week to be sure we are compliant with our intended plans and emergency plan documents. We do have fire retardant coating for any materials that may require it if necessary. 

The Organizational fairs is pleased to announce that three of the rooms upstairs are ready for use as office and workspace! Yes, after years of having the scanning and cataloguing operation work

out of the downstairs office, with no networking available, and the occasional database debacle it causes, we are well on our way to having an organized system for the operation. Scanning, whether on the standard sized Epson Perfection or the extra large Epson Expression scanners, or even copying even larger images on the photo stand with the digital camera will no longer mean rearranging all of that equipment on the drafting table in the office before you can do anything. The Organizational fairy is very pleased about this. The two connecting rooms upstairs are already in use by Archivist Paul Duryea. They may not be completely organized, but they have gone a long ways in that direction. Paul has pretty much done a phenomenal job trying to sort that mess of papers out. 
I am really involved with those projects, which make available information to our members and visitors. We have had long term plans to make what is now the office into a kitchen to service potential clients renting out the Freight Room. If we move all the administrative stuff out of the office and that pretty much clears the room for progress on that project. OMG! What will we do with the kitchen room now? The O.F. has a suggestion for that too. We have wanted for a long time to be able to display the Tolfree dishes in a table setting, but don't want it to take up room in the Freight Room…like it does now. 




Rehberger, Brenda Schecher, Pete and Paul Tandoc, Mike xxx, Greg Logian, Maggi Perkins, and several community service workers.

Castaic that wants to involve their students with upkeep of a couple of areas of our gardens. This would be an ongoing relationship with them which should benefit both our organizations.

We need to talk about the Frank Tenney Johnson Murals. Lo, these many years ago, we were given the Callahan School and the Desert Chapel. The latter had interior walls of gessoed masonite with murals by FTJ. This artist left a small, but important body of work which is valued by western art collectors. Because this mural was in the small chapel exposed to high heat, and deep cold, the mural sustained a great deal of damage. A few years ago, I convinced a conservator to come look at their condition, and she said that it could

stay in the place and situation in which they were safely. Over the years, while stored upstairs in the Station, it became pretty dusty. It also takes up a big percentage of the room in which it is. Last week, I invited an art expert from the Autry Museum to come see the murals. She agreed that they

were probably past display condition, and maybe past restoration. But she also agreed that they shouldn't be disposed of. We discussed options. She said that in then next few years the Autry will have readied a storage facility to house undisplayed artifacts from both the Autry and the Southwest Museums. She thought that the Autry would probably consider taking the murals as a donation, and storing them for later reference and research. She felt that because they have other examples of Johnson's work, that they would be an appropriate



place to keep the murals where they could be properly conserved, and maybe even restored. She is going to try to get one of her conservators to come and advise us on how best to clean and conserve them in the meantime. I would like to have discussion on this question.




I have broached this subject before, and I am going to try it again...can we consider acquiring "station cats?" I am proposing this as an idea to cut down on the number of freeloading tenants of the rodent persuasion. I know that last time I was turned down because some considered it "cruel and unusual" to have cats locked upstairs (to avoid setting off the alarms) when there were no people around. 

#### PRESENTATION BY GUEST:

- See notes Dave Peterson from city of Santa Clarita on the Sept. 22<sup>nd</sup> revision to the Newhall proposed Historic Preservation Ordinance, changes inclusion of opt-in clause, have no recommended list of properties, rely on the languages of the existing ordinance pertaining to site improvements and demolition of property or relocation of historic structures by the property owner. The opt-in clause would be a proposal in the offering clause relies solely on the property owner decision of property owner, there would be no fee for this, however after a year owner can opt-out at their discretion to notify city in writing. On October 18, 2011 at 6:00 P.M. at City Hall attend meeting of planning commission to make a recommendation to not revise this ordinance. If the commission makes recommendation to the council on November 22, 2011 for first reading, then finalize the decision for ordinance to be approved December 13, 2011.
- SCVHS needs to speak up for the historic sites that are currently on the site ordinance, the Opt- in situation needs a positive rebuttal to the lost of historic site. Incentives for this rebuttal could include the Mills Act a 10 years penalty tax relief, no fees for alteration, the Calif. Historic Building Code, Permit Fees, and Tech. Assistance from the staff. Words of proposal for the ordinance are drafted on Thursday before the Tuesday meeting.
- Newhall Jailhouse Manny Santana states if they are promoting historic preservation, how come the city is damaging the old original Jailhouse. Manny wants to know what can be done to preserve the Old Jailhouse, at this rate money is rapidly adding up for repairs needed to fix the damage being done. The bottom line Manny wants the Jailhouse to be preserved. The City has not followed through with what they original set up, they want to cover up mistakes with fresh paint and putty. Ed Marg is quite upset about the ordinance of the jailhouse and the lack of influence or lack of assistance on preserving the Jailhouse. Manny has asked for consent of the SCVHS to please write letter to city, have the lawyer provide letter to standard of old building, Alan will assist and revise letters being typed to mail to city on behalf of the Jailhouse.

- Becky Bataile is currently working on the archives, she is duplicating steps to get items completed for the Historical Society, this alone is a difficult process, and if we had the network set up it would be easier to access our documents. Ethan Trather has been working with Becky on the data; they have been slowed down and blocked by the primitive style of the Historical Society's computer software system. They would like to get Past Perfect Software to update the archive process to the central sever for more data to be entered into the data center. Sue Yurosek motioned to purchase Perfect Software and Hardware for \$600, motioned seconded by Cathy Martin to purchase Perfect Software.
- Shari Fleischman spoke about using Cross Town Cowboys, they are a band who has offered up time to perform a benefit concerts. The SCVHS would be able to sale drinks, cookies and such. There are many possibilities for bringing money into the Historical Society. John Berkstrom, a local musician would love to come with friends and have a benefit concert, or perform in OTNA (Old Downtown Newhall Association). This information could be displayed on the website using a revolving banner advisement. Jack Lilly, a local historian has historical wagons, Hoot Gibson another local history buff would like to be involved. Shari believes we should take advantage of benefits being offered. Another forum is the WMA (western music association) they would like to do events at the station, as well; this is a time to think of opportunities which will enrich the community with these types of venues.
- Wild West Event: James Miller State President for RGA (Reenactments Guild of American), has worked with several public figures, the guild is a new organization with 3,500 members, Butch Shimer, another member, who performs for fun to promote reenactments of the Civil War period, gold panning, historical events from the 1800's, the guild has a strong set of rules and regulations "code of ethics" that must be followed by the laws set by the Reenactment Guild. James and Butch spoke on promoting the reenactment to encourage the SCVHS to start a Western Days, which could make money for the society. The RGA has a mandatory safety check before and after the skit (especially gun shoot-outs), they have a safety officer check all guns before reenactment and after reenactment. The Poetry Festival in April could be a good time to put on a special event, the Poetry Festival will be the week-end of April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2012 could include the Chuck wagon with the reenactment, motion moved by Sue to approve event.

#### PRESENTATION BY GUEST:

Questers'- Oak of Golden Dream Quester, President - Nancy Cordova spoke to the board on the belief that the homes have been mismanaged during the Haunt presentation at the junction. Sue Yurosek, current board member received the first message about the blatant lack of respect for the Questers restoration process on the Kingsbury House and Edison House used during the Haunt. Nancy felt that a phone call, email, text or some type of communication could have been sent in regard to using the houses during the Haunt. Nancy also expressed her disappointment on the fact the water has been turned off, and they have been watering by hand. Nancy has been in distress over the use of the houses since discovering the lack of communication with the Questers. Since the Haunt the houses will be professional cleaned they will send us the next bill for cleaning. Nancy will not recommend one more dollar to be used for the houses and noted that approximately \$200,000 dollars and thousands of volunteer hours restoring, furnishing, and maintaining these museum quality homes.

Quester – Oak of the Golden Dream, Becky Basham states the same sentiments about being extremely disappointed about the lack of respect for the Questers' and what they do for the SCVHS.

Quester - Oak of Golden Dream, and California State Quester, Treasurer, Roberta Harris felt the Kingsbury House and Edison House were turned into a sideshow. These houses are a museum and thousands of dollars and volunteer hours have gone into restoring, furnishing and maintaining the properties inside and outside. Until the Historical Society can prove they are responsible caretakers for the Heritage Junction properties, I personally will advocate that my Questers chapter look for other properties more worthy of support.

Quester – Heritage Reflections, President, Cathy Altuvilla spoke about the troublesome situation and being extremely disappointed to learn about the houses being used in a haunted house set-up.

Cathy and her chapter have taken pride in keeping items in good shape and have invested thousands of dollars and thousands of hours to repair and restore the houses at the junction. She is extremely upset about the lack of communication with the Questers and the SCVHS. Many fundraisers and other events have been staged to assist the process of restoring the houses. She is concerned over the alarm system not working properly, the water being shut off, and the amount of time spent landscaping the area for the historical preservation. She has assisted with school tours, spent time landscaping, four years nurturing the plants, assisted with the center area which was hard as a rock to lay bricks to make a walk way, there isn't a bathroom at the houses and often walking to the restroom is a problem especially for the older woman who come to volunteer, that having people come through the house for any other reason is not an agreeable arrangement to their Quester chapter.

Quester, Louise Schultz wrote a letter and spoke to Ed Marg for 45 minutes on the phone, Ed reassured her there would be better communication with the Questers. They're concerned with the antiques in the houses, and other details like the floor being misused were a reason to be upset, however, he and his volunteers did think about these details before using the house for the Haunt. Ed assured her that the SCVHS will consult the Questers in the future and make arrangements before hand when the houses are used for any other purpose than the attended purpose.

Barbara Martinelli received four individual letters two half weeks ago from DeeAnn Wood, Dee Roche, and Roberta Harris, about the concerns of the Questers and the lack of respect over using the houses during the Haunt. She called board president, Alan Pollack, she read letters to Ed Marg, and days later she received two more letters from Barbara Johnson and Dorothy Boyer. Ed Marg contacted Louise Schultz and Roberta Harris, he sincerely apologize to all the Questers. He discovered there wasn't one group of Questers, but three groups. He reassured them that he and his volunteers took extra special care in harboring items within the house. He personally made sure nothing could get broken or damaged with the house; Scott Sivley took extra care in putting things away to ensure a positive impact for the ghost walk on the Haunt. Scott apologized to the Questers for any misunderstanding in the purpose for using the house for the Haunt. Sue Yurosek board member and Quester herself felt it would have been nice to know ahead of time so they could have removed, for safe keeping the items in the houses. Ed continued to inform the group they did not have the facts about the history of the house and instead used the history of the Saint Francis Dam disaster to make it a ghost haunt house. Ed explained that he went through the house many times to assure the safety of the items and the preservation of the houses as well. He personally went on the tour to check for any problems and to make sure all things were managed correctly, the guest walked through then straight out the back door. Ed severely apologized for any misgivings over using the houses and explained the water problem, he was checking the water issue, the water bill has been excessive which caused him to go through and check all the pipes in the junction, he is not sure why the water is being turned off at the Kingsbury house, but he will check into the situation. Nancy Cordova wants to know why the timer is not coming on and why the water is being turned off as well. She explained that someone has taken off the faucet tops, she rather have a clean bum, than have the faucet top removed, she wants to be able to have the water on.

Sue Yurosek wants the board to know how much money has been used to restore the houses and wanted to know how much money was brought in by the Haunt, approximately \$11,000 to \$12,000 was earned according to Duane Harte.

Sue Yurosek feels she is in the middle since she volunteers for both the Questers and the Historical Society, she does not want to lose the support of the Questers, and she is personally sorry for any inconvenience or misunderstandings brought on by the Haunt, she feels their needs to be respect between the Questers and the Historical Society, the houses need to be respected and be used like a museum.

Laurene Weste board member stated that enough is enough, SCVHS has lost the respect of media, has lost the respect of the Questers, the SCVHS can't function, when they lose their core support, they need appropriate management of the artifacts, they do not have enough resources to continue the real historic preservation.

- Duane Harte replied to the Questers our true respect for their organization and would go to the moon and back for them, he did explain the water bill being the absolute truth of \$600 dollars for excessive amounts water and where it has been used.
- Barbara Martinelli not on the board long but the Questers have assisted with the school tours, she values the association, she wants them to be clear from this point on she will not make any use of the buildings without corresponding with them first, she will work on maintaining communication between them by contact of phone or email.
- Alan Pollack has ensured the Questers they may contact him anytime to discuss any
  issues, Alan will give his phone number and email to move forward to make things better
  at this point in time.
- A suggestion to increase board members capacity by two to four new bodies, in hope to gain a better insight of issues to be concerned about at the junction.
- Plans for better communication between the Questers and the Historical Society to keep all involved in the loop by email.
- All in all, in a community that has grown in population and becoming more visible, the society needs to continue working with the Questers, our mission to teach preservation, and the society needs friends and supporters because the houses are priceless.
- The Historical Society will communicate any further using of the houses to the Questers; the Society will work between now and next meeting to alleviate the situation of the houses from happening again.
- Will work on this situation and gather contact information of Questers to make a list of suggestion to resolve this problem.

Rhonda and Brittany Vigeant – Spoke to the board about Publicity for the Historical Society for a Crowd Funding Campaign. Both she and her daughter are interested in preserving the pictures on film for the Historical Society.

- Appoint a campaign manager to interface with them, over a 90 day period.
- Assist by checking with the local High School Guidance Counselor a student who would like to assist with this project.
- What about publicity, what can be expected.
- Get hands on experience by assisting with this project.
- Create a video for the fund raising campaign

- Include archival footage plus interview people in the community for preserving home movies and historical footage.
- Have a contest
- Use SCV photos
- Use social media
- Use hometown radio
- Ask the local papers, Signal and Daily News
- Create Flyers
- Create Newsletters

Brittany let's move forward to get this started, what is the next step, create a campaign manager, board voted to allow Rhonda Vigeant to begin crowd raising campaign. Ed Marg will assist to find out how much film is in our possession and where to begin the starting point. Ed and Rhonda will look through the film and set date to determine what we need to do to move forward. First, an inventory is needed and a specific goal needs to be set as to what the money will be used for. Permission has been given for Rhonda and Brittany to begin fund raising campaign. They will report back to board by next meeting.

#### Jamey Dinkle - Director of Archives,

- Has ordered and received several boxes and albums for archiving, approximately 481 photos.
- She has some community service workers who will assist her on the December 15<sup>th</sup>, Open House at the junction. They are also helping upstairs with archiving and in the map room.
- December 15<sup>th</sup>, event is a priority and hoping to generate visitors with recent flyers, pumps up membership, sales and donations. She will set up a box for senior citizen in our community that has a need for Christmas items.
- Working on filing for a grant need financials from Duane Harte before deadline.
- Needs more information on how to authorize Pay Pal account for shipping of eBay items as they go out. Duane Harte will work this out with Jamey
- Need ink for printer upstairs, as soon as possible. Duane Harte will take care of purchasing ink for upstairs printers.
- Has been supervising community service workers, and many have come back to help after serving their time.

Note in red the responses/conversations with the Board:

I am proposing again for a resolution to the problem of archiving allowances. What I need is either access to a debit/credit card, cash allowance, or checks from the account of SCVHS to be able to purchase items that cannot be billed to the Historical Society. For example, I have a72 year old poster in very fragile condition that needs a frame. I cannot get one because I have no way to do so. I have no safe place to put it right now that is out of reach of curious people putting their paws on it, and in the elements and space I need it to be in. I cannot afford these things up front and wait to be reimbursed. I am also severely limited to what marketing I can do for SVHS because of this. At most, the marketing I would like to accomplish would cost \$15 a month. There are other artifacts and items that need care/purchasing that I am unable to purchase, and this is an ongoing problem, as I've mentioned before. How can this be fixed?

This was solved by Duane asking Jamey if she would accept a \$50 monthly check written out to "cash" in addition to the \$200 that is spent on Gaylord 95% of the time. This check could be cashed by Jamey and use those funds to purchase non-billable, 'store-bought' items. Jamey accepted. After the meeting was over, Duane handed her a check (Jamey will be using each check given to account for the *following* month's financial records).

Since I seem to have 2-3 stable volunteers coming in now, they tend to come in on the same days. Since I've started seeing this pattern, I've combined inventory, organizing documents and photos, and archiving into one fluid project that they all work on together. I have given them the run of the map room, so they've made it their own organized disaster. I've told them it's ok to leave it however they want so when they come back, they can easily pick up where they left off. They have been properly trained on the care of the items and storing them for the time they'll be gone. If I could ask the board and other volunteers to be conscious of this and to leave it as is for them, it would benefit me greatly.

The Board has no issue with that.

Last month, I mentioned some issues with Past Perfect and the inability to use some of its services effectively. Those problems have since been resolved.

In the next coming newsletter, I'd like to ask if we can mention the involvement and effectiveness of the Signal's attempt to draw attention to the St. Francis Dam tour. Between them and I, a second tour bus had to be ordered to meet popular demands. I think that was a huge success; more than we originally anticipated. I would like to simply give credit where credit is due. As with every event I somehow get myself into, it drains me. I've already taken the needed time off, and no longer need a hug-me jacket.

Alan agreed that something would be fit in for the Signal.

I'd like to propose to the Board an EAS class be held here once a week in the evenings. The security guard Al is asking if this can be made possible here in the freight room from around 6-8pm, hours and days being negotiable. Since he is with the county, the exception can be made to extend open doors

here after hours. They would be held during the week to avoid any conflict in the future for events being held here. I would be willing to monitor the class. I've given him the rental agreement to give to the instructor of the class; a lady he knows and trusts. He'd like it to be held here so the people being taught here can also become aware of SCVHS, who we are, and what we have, etc. Of course, I invite Roberto to join or even monitor some classes, being that he is passionate about the Hispanic culture being entwined with SCVHS.

The Board agreed that the teacher's credentials, certification, student's info, and any other related information to teaching in CA are required. I believe I recall someone stating that Norm might want to look at her paperwork to insure validation. It was agreed that the regular pricing for room/station rental would be charged. Copies of that are upstairs. \*\*\*Update: I contacted Al Elwig about this afterward who stated he would hand her the necessary documents I gave him for her and inform her of the requirements. I have yet to hear from either one of them about this since.

Does anyone have any updates regarding the large Canon printer in the old office? I was told recently that it would be fixed or gone within a week after mentioning it to someone about it back in early March. It has still yet to be removed. I'm wondering if anyone knows why we need it if we have other printers available in working condition that are a fraction of its size?

I was told by the Board to wait another week to figure out what anyone would like to do with it. If nothing is done, then we (basically meaning I) need to call for a bulky item pick up. \*\*\*As of the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of April I believe, nothing had been done with it. No bulky-item company is willing to come out and get it due to its size and indoor location. I have had to since take it apart piece by piece and drag the items to the recycling dumpster. The gut of it is still there, however; it is a big job, but is being worked on.

Jamey questioned the possibility of 'restoring' Beale's Cut, since it is Historic. This was brought up tailing another discussion, I believe. Jamey was told that at this time, it's not possible due to hazardous conditions there. Even after Jamey offered up County inmates to work on it, the project was still denied.

\*\*\*As of April 21<sup>st</sup>, Jamey is still wondering what can be done, any brainstorming that can happen with the Board. I was asked by 2 SCV residents recently (they are related) if they could bring a shovel and weed whacker up there when they could. I soon learned they were actually serious when they reminded me that it is legal to hike in parts of that area and there are no "NO SHOVEL" signs. I was asked that if no "organized" group worked on this together, but the community did so whenever they came around if it was legal. I declined to answer. With or without the existence of this "idea", I myself am still trying to find a way through this. I'd like to know how, from the Board.

Hart Park will be doing some sort of movie drive-in on certain summer nights, and asked if they could borrow our Western films to play for some shows.

I was told no- we need not risk our items by lending them out when they can obtain the movies elsewhere. It was noted that we'd also be getting nothing in return.





### PRESENTATION BY GUEST:

\*Loren Valin-Flores- SCV Outdoor Market – Presented SCVHS Board with a check of \$250.00 from the Outdoor Market of September 6& 7th. The purpose of the Outdoor Market will be to raise funds for the Junction, maintain the museum and other projects, and improve the Junction. Subject: **REPORT - JANUARY 2014** 

1. Each month I shall submit a report on activities and concerns at Heritage Junction. This is the first report. Please feel free to comment on and/or request more information as you desire or require.

2. I shall report my observations of each individual building and the grounds in general.

### 3. PARDEE HOUSE:

Interior renovations are progressing well. Bathroom tile is in place and trim work is of the highest quality. It should be complete, (if funding is available), for the Cowboy Festival. Attempting to find a wheelchair lift system we can afford.

We need to give the highest praise to the contractor. His work is exemplary. In addition the house has been connected to the sewer system making the restroom operational at last.

### 4. NEWHALL RANCH HOUSE:

The exterior paint isn't correct. The original colors were bright white with hunter green trim.

The Newhall Ranch House is the building that is in the poorest condition. Some of the problems were caused long before it was moved from Newhall Land and Farming but the greatest damage and problems have been due to the building's use as the centerpiece of the annual Halloween haunted house event.

When we, the Santa Clarita Valley Historical Society allow such events to take place it is the height of hypocrisy. It is the job of the SCVHS to preserve and protect the buildings we own and to have them used as a stage for some cheap theatrical "freak shows" does not conform to what we, as a historical society, want to or should do. The wiring additions to support the show; the room added in the second floor; suspected non-conforming electrical system modifications; material and equipment storage and many other conditions do not make the Ranch House a place that is a testament to the preservation of our history but rather make it look like something that is a cross between a poorly constructed movie set and a episode of the TV show about hoarding.

There has not been a permit to occupy the building and 15 January 2015 the Los Angeles County Fire Department inspection reported that occupancy is not permitted. To conform to this requirement all electrical power has been turned off and the electrical distribution panel locked.

Recommend remaining "Halloween Haunt" material be removed from the house and the property by 1 March 2015. Enough has been removed so that decorations from Christmas can be stored in one room.

### 5. SAUGUS DEPOT

The leak in the roof of the freight room was repaired. Christmas decorations removed and a general cleaning accomplished. Saturday, 24 January 2015 was the first event in the station/depot this year. It appears that is was a success.

I'm wondering where the doors to the two offices upstairs are located? Made a search but no luck. Will continue.

The CCTV system has been unpowered. I need to find locations of all the cameras and equipment. In any event the wiring feeds look like they were thrown together. A proper cabinet and system would not only look better but may even work. Until all personnel and docents are trained in the CCTV system it shall remain secured.

Working a a CCTV plan to ensure personnel are trained in its use and what should be done if there is a break-in.

Waiting on an estimate for the roof repairs, (Roofing replacement). Don't expect it until late January.

The temporary awning frame over the platform has been removed and stored for future use.

### 6. GENERAL GROUNDS AND OUTBUILDINGS

Grounds conditions can be stated simply: "Lot of little piles of junk looking for a dumpster with scattered tools looking for a home". Many of those piles have been removed and placed in the dumpster. Trailers in the parking area behind the Pardee house have been moved to the area near the dumpsters.

About 20 young men and women from the LDS church spent almost 4 hours cleaning the station windows, removing outside lights, removing and stacking the pallets and plywood used for the Halloween Haunt thus reducing the places that termites could nest and breed. They also stacked the unused pavers near the Kingsbury House and moved a lot of useless wood scraps and trash to improve the visual conditions.

The electric golf cart needs batteries but it is recommended that the cart be returned to the donor or sold. Then the shed it is in can be used for other purposes or removed entirely. An electric golf cart has a lot of maintenance and at present needs new batteries with an estimated cost of \$600 or more. If we need a cart for large events we can rent one for a few days.

There are items from the Halloween Haunt stored in the containers on site and a shed called the "Pirates Shed". That all needs to be removed from the grounds. We don't have room for our historic items let alone items from a single event. There are also three large trailers on the property of a board member that need to be emptied and moved to a scrap yard or sold. Historic items in the trailers can be consolidated into one of the trailers and all other material, (much from the Halloween Haunt), must be moved.

The use of buildings and grounds must be scheduled through staff then approved by the board of directors. It is a simple "chain-of-command" operation so that nothing happens without approval. It also provides the documentation necessary for SCVHS and Los Angeles County Parks and Recreation. Events not approved increase our liability should something happen to people, buildings and grounds.

To prevent what happened with the Newhall Ranch House electrical system I have established the following simple rule. All modifications and repairs to buildings and property shall only be accomplished by licensed, bonded persons with all appropriate permits and authorizations approved prior to any work being done. This protects personnel performing the work and also the SCVHS should an accident occur.

Pavers have been laid between the Edison and Kingsbury homes. Looks great. May have a couple of weddings scheduled for the summer. Waiting on the bride's to make a decision.

The pine trees nearest the train need to be removed. Hart Park agrees. The drought and bark beetles are killing all of them. Will find when the county can remove same. Recommend that three replacement trees be planted. We can get mitigation oak trees, (both California live oak and Valley Oak), free and also have them planted. Will do when the pines are removed. Also recommend that we sell the tree plantings as a "Heritage Donation" of maybe \$5,000 with an appropriate marker. This was done with the first oak tree in that area.

All locks on the Depot, Ranch House and Pardee house have been replaced.

Light pole installation can also be used as a fund raising aid. Questers provided the poles and can be given due credit at each pole with a plaque. Installation donors can also be added to the plaque. SoCal Edison is to come by to see if they can install the poles.

Still working with a very significant donor/foundation. They are looking at tax implications for other concerns they have before committing to us. They said it is still a pretty sure thing.

Have to re-submit our Historic Preservation Grant Request to the City. Need an additional contractor's estimate. The Community grant paper is almost ready for submission.

Do not know the implications of the new County Historic Preservation Ordinance that may be adopted this week. We can always hope.

I was invited by the SCV Rotary Club to speak. Got a great lunch and a lot of questions. At least our name is out there a little more.

Attended the Old Town Newhall Association monthly meeting. Cowboy Festival plans are driving the show with OTNA.

SCV Marketplace is continuing the first weekend of every month and will have a small footprint for Cowboy Festival.

### 7. FUTURE IDEAS AND PLANS

Once again looking at the Blacksmith Shop construction. It would be built just North of the current equipment yard. Along with the shop would be a maintenance building and offices.

Still hoping to acquire funds for a dining car and caboose. Location would be next to the engine on the same new tracks for the dining car. The caboose can fit behind the engine.

Quonset hut contruction depends on the county once we have drawings ready. Only one small hut to be built for a veterans museum. Between the Blacksmith's shop and the Quonset hut it was suggested that we have a full sized school house like Felton School Mentryville.

Meeting with Bobbie Jean Bell of Out West to find if we can use the depot for a music venue featuring both local and national artists. After seeing what the Freight room looks like this weekend I think we could really have a great place for concerts.

### 8. CONCLUSION

Heritage Junction or the SCVHS should become every bit as "classy" as Williamsburg or Yorktown, Virginia. The sooner we can depart from the cluttered collection of stuff that is in our buildings and grounds the sooner additional donors will be willing to contribute. The interior of the PARDEE House is a great start in that direction. I hope we can continue.

Mr. Phillips:

It has come to my attention that the Newhall Ranch House located at Heritage Junction in William S. Hart Park is currently occupied without a Permit of Occupancy issued by the Fire Department. A fire inspection conducted today revealed multiple violations of the Uniform Building and Fire Codes including, but not limited to, substandard electrical modifications and significant degradation of fire-resistance-rated construction throughout the structure.

## **IULY 2015**

### **Executive Director's monthly report:**

- 1. General Conditions of grounds at Heritage Junction
- A. Weed control is non-existent. Recommend hiring a company that can provide initial weed control/clearing and then have them do a weekly or bi-weekly clearing. It is very obvious that volunteers are not getting the work accomplished.
- B. The folks from the gardening society came once and since have not returned to continue upkeep of the rose gardens between the Pardee and Newhall Ranch House. They once again filled many bags with weeds and left them sitting on the garden pathways. Need to know the status of this group.
- C. Recommend any remaining items from the Heritage Haunt and the Haunted Pirate ship be disposed of as soon as possible. It has been seven months now and that has been more than enough time to clear out those items. The company that is hired to clear the weeds can also clear out the sheds and junk. When the shed is empty items now in the train yard can be moved inside.
- D. We need to ascertain actual ownership of the three large trailers now parked on the property of a member. Any items that belong to the SCVHS should be moved to another storage location and the trailers moved or sold.
- E. Water leaks continued in the supply valves located near the Pardee House. Plumber has been called to repair it again.
- F. Request authorization to change garbage cans now in use. Will move the dumpsters to a location between the Train Station and the Newhall Ranch House. Request authorization to have fencing built to cover the dumpsters.
- G. There is a rusted and forgotten riding lawnmower in the area where the bricks are stacked. Request authorization to have it hauled by junk dealer. Some other items of like value also are in that area. They should be removed at the same time.
- H. Request authority to have any and all items not belonging to the SCVHS removed and disposed of in a proper manner. This includes old pallets, plywood, lumber pieces near the campground gate and other such material. Again, the same company that would clear weeds could accomplish this.

J. Request clarification of policy regarding all items/material being stored on or at Heritage Junction that does not belong to the SCVHS. Private items should not be stored at Heritage Junction.

## 2. Building issues and conditions:

## A. Pardee House. No recent work accomplished.

- 1. Request considering making the small room a docent kitchen and rest area and the room now considered being the Gift Shop. Moving of plumbing and electrical isn't a problem at this stage of modifications.
- C. Need a licensed/bonded professional architect to determine the structural integrity of the main room ceiling. Was it properly modified or would it a risk for future use?

### B. Newhall Ranch House:

- 1. New front steps still require painting and preservation. In addition the siding also must be replaced to prevent entry into the basement.
  - 2. Windows upstairs need to be sealed/repaired prior to winter.
  - 3. Electricity is turned off.

## C. Saugus Train Station:

- 1. Telephone system needs repairs to eliminate static and noise on the line. Much of the problem is caused by the lines running for security to the EDISON House and the other buildings. Recommend building security be changed to a wireless system.
- 2. The wireless computer system needs replacement or improvement. The wired system is old and may be causing many of the problems we are having.
- 3. To date nobody has come to look at the excess electronic equipment in the offices upstairs.
- 4. All older lighting needs to be replaced Long tubed lighting is not good for viewing the collection and are difficult to change. Recommend that a electrical/lighting contractor be hired to upgrade the entire station from the 1950's to at least 2015.

5. Large sliding doors are sagging when operated. This is damaging the doors and complete failure is possible. Professional contractor should be hired to fix.

### D. Quester's Court buildings:

1. Need to have electrical systems checked and repaired as necessary. All exterior plugs need to be GFI capable and more need to be installed. This is for all the buildings in the court.

### E. General grounds:

1. Old and unused landscape watering systems on the west side of the main road need to be removed and discarded. They are an eyesore and should someone be on the hill they could caused injury.

### Additional information:

I really enjoy the work I do for the Society but I cannot continue to work without any hope for compensation. At the current price of gas it is costing me about \$10 a day. Most weeks I am at the Junction at least 6 of the 7 days. That comes to nearly \$240 per month in fuel costs for me. I use my own vehicle to haul trash and attend meetings in town along with trips to City and County offices.

I've cut back the hours I'm spending until I can be assured that I may be paid. Clearly the members of the board can see this problem I'm faced with. I don't consider it fair or proper for the Board of Directors to have me continue to work and not, with the exception of two or three board members, be willing enlist more volunteer help with respect to grounds keeping and general maintenance or entertain a just and fair form of compensation for me. Please let me know what is proposed.

Darryl Manzer will provide services for SCVHS upon the terms and conditions set forth below, and will be paid according to the performance of these services in the amount of \$400.00 per month for the term of 4 months unless he is terminated before the expiration of this contract.

SCVHS will obtain Worker's Compensation insurance for Darryl Manzer for the term of his employment.

The position of Site Manager is an employee and not a Board position. The Site Manager will report to the board monthly at their meetings, and directly to the President if necessary in the interim.

Darryl Manzer may not conduct any business that may be in conflict with, or be detrimental to the success of the SCVHS, the membership or Board Members. If any conflict of interest cannot be resolved, the SCVHS may terminate this agreement.

The Site Manager will at all times exercise good judgment and skill. He shall use his knowledge, training and experience in performing services requested of him. He shall perform his duties with safety as his first priority.

All confidential information shall be and remain the property of SCVHS. This agreement shall remain in effect even after the expiration of this agreement. Confidential information shall remain confidential after this agreement terminates. Any tangible or intangible object created during the scope of work under this contract shall remain the property of SCVHS.

Payment for services rendered will be paid the First of every month, beginning on October 1, 2015, and ending in January 2016 providing this agreement remains in effect for the full duration.

SCVHS, treasurer, Duane Harte will pay Darryl Manzer for reasonable and customary expenses, according to budgets provided in grants and approved by the board of directors. Any and all expenses above \$50 must be approved before the expenditures are made. Incidental expenditures below \$50 must be agreed upon between the President, or Treasurer, and Darryl Manzer before expenditures are made. Reimbursement will be made at the same time that payment for services rendered is made, beginning October 1, 2015. All expenditures MUST have receipts, and receipts are to be turned in to the treasurer before payment is made.

Termination of this agreement may be made at any time by either party for any reason. Any property of SCVHS in the possession of Darryl Manzer must be returned immediately upon termination.

Darryl Manzer agrees to defend, hold harmless, and indemnify SCVHS against any and all losses, including, but not limited to attorney fees, costs, damages, claims, expenses or other liability whatsoever, including but not limited to accident, or injury to persons or property, to the extent caused directly by Consultant's negligent or intentional misconduct in the performance of this agreement.

The SCVHS and Darryl Manzer agree to attempt to resolve any conflicts informally. Should the parties be unable to reach agreement, they agree to use an impartial arbitrator to resolve any dispute. Arbitration costs will be the responsibility of the challenging party. Attorney's fees shall be the responsibility of the party incurring them and shall not be awarded to the prevailing party.

## 2016 Cowboy Festival

## Santa Clarita Valley Historical Society Rental Proposal

## INTRODUCTION

In 2015 the Cowboy Festival was held for the first time at William S. Hart Park. Although the festival was ultimately a success for all involved parties, the relocation to William S. Hart Park presented new challenges in event partnership. The City made every effort to accommodate the organizations that were directly impacted by the change in festival location by allowing these Community Partners to produce their own activities in conjunction with the Cowboy Festival.

The separately produced Community Partner events seemed to be the best model during the planning stages of the event. However, it was realized during festival implementation that these separately produced events gave the Cowboy Festival a disjointed and fragmented feeling, which was not the intention of the City or Community Partners.

The City is proposing the following solution to resolve the disconnectedness of the 2015 Cowboy Festival and ensure a cohesive 2016.

## 2016 PROPOSAL

The 2016 Cowboy Festival will be held the weekend of April 23 and 24, 2016. The City of Santa Clarita would like to rent Heritage Junction, including The Pardee Home, Newhall Ranch House, Saugus Train Station, Mitchel Adobe and Mogul Locomotive, for the duration of the festival. However, the City would like the Santa Clarita Valley Historical Society (SCVHS) to operate their gift shop, quester houses, and museum during the festival.

In addition, the City would assume responsibility for all programming of gear vendors, food vendors, beverage sales, activities, and entertainment within Heritage Junction. By centralizing programming with the City for both the Cowboy Festival and Heritage Junction it will streamline the delivery of information and eliminate confusion amongst vendors and participants.

Furthermore, the City would also ask that as part of the rental of Heritage Junction that the SCVHS not host any evening performances or activities while the City is renting the property. Though this would not include the Historical Society Bus Tour, held last year on Sunday, April 19, 2015, should the SCVHS be interested in hosting that tour in 2016.

The City of Santa Clarita would compensate the Santa Clarita Valley Historical Society with a payment of \$5,500 for use of Heritage Junction. This amount is based on the revenue raised by the SCVHS from vendors and beverage sales at the 2015 Cowboy Festival.

### **Archives Committee Update**

During the 9/26/16 SCVHS board meeting Ann Stansell was asked to organize an archives committee and support Sarah Thompson as a contact between the board and archives team.

On 11/19/16 the archives committee held their first meeting. Present were archivist Sarah Thompson, CSUN student/archive intern Robert Harbeston, archive volunteer Mandee McFerren, and board member Ann Stansell. We met at the SCVHS from 9:30 AM-noon to identify and discuss current archives related questions/comments/concerns and to review the current state of the collections/collections storage/archives work space.

## Meeting topics/activities included:

- (1) Identifying issues with Past Perfect. We were unable to open the program or access SCVHS specific data. Robert will identify which computers the program is on and trouble shoot access over the next few weeks.
- (2) Determining which computers/printers/scanners are functioning and those that no longer work. Non-functioning equipment has been stacked on a desk in the corner of the archives work space. It is suggested that this equipment be fixed or disposed of/removed from the building.
- (3) Reviewing the current control/access policy for the archives. All agree that access to the archives/collections should be limited to trained archivists and individuals OKed through the board. It is suggested that the upstairs be turned into a restricted access collections area and any non-collections activities currently taking place upstairs should be relocated to the former Saugus Café room downstairs. Artifacts currently stored in the Saugus Café room should be moved upstairs to the archives, and archaeology collections should be relocated to an approved repository. Archive material/artifacts should not leave the collections space unless a loan/transfer request is filled out and approved by the lead archivist and board.
- (4) Looking for the document listing the Newhall/Saugus area men killed in WWI. Not located but on the radar/to do list.
- (5) Reviewing current work being undertaken in the archives. Sorting through boxes in the archives storage area and separating based on historical topic, type of material, etc.
- (6) Discussing current needs...support, supplies, etc. Good with what we currently have in way of supplies..Will pass along requests to the board, as needed.
- (7) Identifying upcoming training opportunities. May 10-13, 2017 California Preservation Conference in Pasadena. July 2017 Western Archival Institute two week intensive training. Sarah will look into these opportunities and their costs. She currently thinks Pasadena is the best option given there would be no travel/lodging costs.

Work in the archives will continue over the winter break and our next meeting will be after the holidays.

On 11/27/16 Robert Harbeston provided the following update:

I have a positive update on the Past Perfect situation.

So it turns out the computer that was in the archives area is the only computer that can open Past Perfect but it needs to be connected to the network to do so. Since the computer does not have a wireless card, I temporarily moved it into the other office where it can be connected and accessed with an Ethernet cable (and disconnected and marked the two computers that do not boot up).

Now the program can be opened, the next problem will be gaining access to add information.

There are previously created users accounts (Alan Pollack, Angela Chadbourne, Becky Bataille, Bob Bennett, Ed, Ethan, Leslie Bretall, Pat Saletore and visitor) which are locked with passwords, but through the guest account I can see the previously archived information. It looks like there is a lot of information entered and it is currently stored on the main computer in the office. Definitely needing a backup, Past Perfect shows the last backup date being 11/14/13, but at least we now know where the data is stored and how it can be accessed.

- Philip Scorza presented interested in a project to put together Hart High pictures from yearbooks, etc., from school beginnings thru the 1950's, and put it in book or magazine form.
- Leon Worden film student at Cal Arts doing a reenactment for his thesis, working on a 2 minutes and 33 seconds clip. Charles Alton talks about the St. Francis Dam, student will allow SCVHS to use footage once created. Leon making a motion for Cal Arts student to approve an audio license agreement for non-elusive use of voice recording which if part of a longer 1985 video produced by the society, Brian Smee will use audio as part of a thesis reenactment of the dam disaster, seconded by Laurene Weste. - Leon Worden purchased dinosaur bones which may be from the L.A. tar-pits area, a contractor on trolley digging a trench kept the bones, the bones ended up on arts antiquity market, and Leon purchased them. Would the historical society like to have these bones? These bones show past and prehistoric history of Santa Clarita Valley area. Leon will donate to the historical society his purchase. Ann Stancell will prepare donation form.
- Cathy Martin emailed Mike Jarel, to inform him that the stack of wood in the train yard is from the Mojove train station water tower. It was donated to SCVHS for our depot.

I'm really excited about the list of St. Francis related anniversary activities that was circulated at the last board meeting. I appreciate all the SCVHS folks that have been attending the monthly 90th commemorative planning sessions in Fillmore, and Dianne for taking notes, adding ideas to the list, and sharing the list with us.

Per our discussions at the meeting, my understanding is that the SCVHS hopes to contribute to this larger effort in numerous ways. Among the various plans Dianne mentioned, one aspect that is near and dear to my heart is raising funds to place memorials at each of the unmarked graves of flood victims. To this end, in 2011 James Snead and I created the Forgotten Casualties Project, based in the Anthropology Dept. at CSUN. To date we've raised just over \$1,000. As part of this effort, I've compiled a list of the flood victims buried in unmarked graves (list attached) and conducted genealogical research to connect with living relatives for their input on how to memorialize each grave. Given my ongoing interest and existing relationships with staff at each of the cemeteries in the flood zone, I'd like to merge CSUNs efforts with those of the SCVHS and take the lead on these specific fundraising efforts. Before transferring the funds collected to date to the SCHVS, and beginning a public campaign, I wanted to clarify with the board that we're collecting funds for through the SCVHS non-profit? Tom, we already have an account for disaster related memorialization, right?

Also, given the time we dedicated to discussing St Francis at the last meeting, I propose we start holding a sub-committee meeting to discuss SCVHS specific commemoration efforts. I'd imagine Dianne would like to take the lead on this, but I would be happy to if that is not the case.

P.S., Here are the current statistics on SFDD casualties compiled from the claim files at the LADWP archives, historic newspapers, cemetery sexton records, etc.

411 = maximum number of victims = 308 recovered (240 identified + 68 unidentified) + 103 missing (79 missing, claim + 24 missing, no claim)

343 = minimum number of victims = 240 identified + 103 missing (accounts for maximum overlap between missing and unidentified)

Statistics regarding memorialization:

411 maximum number of victims = 178 marked graves +121 unmarked graves (53 identified + 68 unidentified) + 1 unknown burial location for Jessie Lloyd Asher + 28 missing/cenotaphs (missing but marked) +75 missing (103 total missing - 28 cenotaph) + 8 cremated (identified, not buried)

To the members of the SCVHS Board,

I spent some time at the depot earlier today clearing weeds in the train yard and have a few issues I'd like read before the Board at tomorrows meeting.

- 1. The rear fence section at the south end of the train yard is completely broken away and is just leaning against the other sections. This obviously presents a serious security and liability issue as trespassers can literally walk into the train yard. I'm sure it was never intended for the rear section to be permanently attached, so as to allow large materials to be moved into or out of the yard, so there needs to be thought given how to secure the fence section in a way that it can be removed when needed. Attention to this matter needs to be immediate.
- 2. The interior condition of the Ranch House is seriously deteriorating. The wood shake roof is in terrible shape, is a fire hazard, and apparently is leaking since there is a worsening mold situation in the interior walls and ceiling. A window pane has been broken out on the south end of the building, and there is a serious rodent infestation with much of the flooring covered with droppings. This along with the mold situation presents a real health hazard to anyone entering or working in the house. I don't know what remedies are available to the Board but the condition of the structure needs to be stabilized at the very minimum to prevent further deterioration and a far greater restoration expense.
- 3. The front (trackside) of the depot in the train yard is slowly turning into a junk storage yard. Ladders in various states of condition, old lumber, bricks, cinder blocks, saw horses, and all sorts of materials left over from the haunt have been left against the front wall. The train yard should not be a dumping ground. This side of the depot faces Newhall Ave. and should be kept in a condition to showcase the depot as a "working" railroad station with materials in front resticted to actual railroad artifacts. The present condition presents a fire hazard (old dry lumber) and attracts rodents, snakes, etc., and is just unsightly. An effort needs to be made to determine what the Society really wants to keep, and those materials moved to either the storage area behind the locomotive, or a more appropriate location. The rest should be properly discarded. I'm available to help with this but the Board needs to be involved.

Thanks for allowing me to bring these issues to the attention of the Board.

PRESENTATION BY GUEST: Fleur Fong spoke about the Metro link mess up of the Lang Station plaques ... there were approximately 2,000 Chinese workers who worked the rails. According to Fleur the Metro Link has changed right away of 1953, there are two plaques which the Chinese Historical Society is not able to get to these plaques. Fleur would like to the plaques relocated. A year half ago Metro Link retracted the monument and put the station on top of markers, one can literally see the plaques. Leon Worden has been dealing with Supervisor Barger's office on this issue and they're on top of it but they don't have anything to report yet ... it might not seem like it, but it is a complex, multijurisdictional issue. Who owns the road? Many parties are included in this mess. The plaques need to be moved, but where should the plaques be relocated? There are plans in the future to improve the intersection, but then the plaques will be move once again. Leon and Fleur will keep SCVHS posted on this issue.

Issue of contamination at site needs to be addressed:

- Eugene Moy, President of the Chinese Historical Society would like to have a plaque for the San Fernando tunnel. Due to location of the tunnel CHS has made a suggestion to have marker placed within Hart Park.
- Frank Oviedo from the City of Santa Clarita spoke on grant information. Currently, 70% electrical for the Pardee house will be completed. An engineer who worked on historical Coronado Hotel will take care of

electrical pay out procedure. He is waiting for structure report, all is well with structural development of Pardee House. This may take two days to repair with carpenter on minimal items, Frank is aware of the buildings and Frank will speak about grant. Newhall Ranch House is next on the list for historical repair. Many historical remodels have not been completed correctly and this needs to be readdressed. The city requires permits to complete the remodel process. This needs to be fulfilled with quality people whom are aware of historical remodeling and have been approved by the city.

- Frank Oviedo gave crucial information on the grant process work and provided to grant details to SCVHS. Grants come from tax dollars and money spent needs to be accounted for accurately. Grant applications must be in place, contractors must be licensed and in good standing with agency and they must know how to pull permits, have building department with contractors for resources, invoice with paper work with proper letterhead proper documentation, there is a person who oversees the grant. Must follow the process and procedures.
- Electrician with the Pardee House states project is moving along and is almost completed. Maxwell Electric is completing this task.
