The Walk of Western Stars began in 1981 to honor the legends of Western film, television and radio who have contributed to America's heritage since 1900.

The Old West comes alive again each year when western stars are immortalized in bronze and terrazzo tile on the streets of Old Town Newhall during the City of Santa Clarita's Cowboy Festival.

William S. Hart Park & Museum:

Tour this 1927 Spanish Colonial Revival estate of silent movie star William S. Hart, which includes an impressive collection of art, native American artifacts and a herd of American Bison gifted to the star by Walt Disney himself.

Mentryville: This former 1880's oil boomtown was home to more than 100 families and was the longest continually operating oil well in the world before it closed in 1990. See historic buildings, including a one-room school house and the oil well itself – Pico No. 4.
